

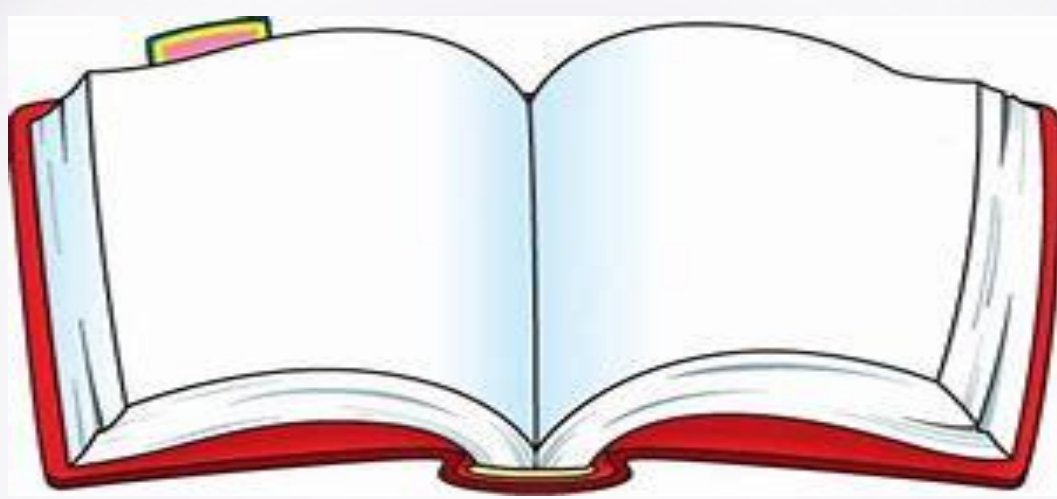

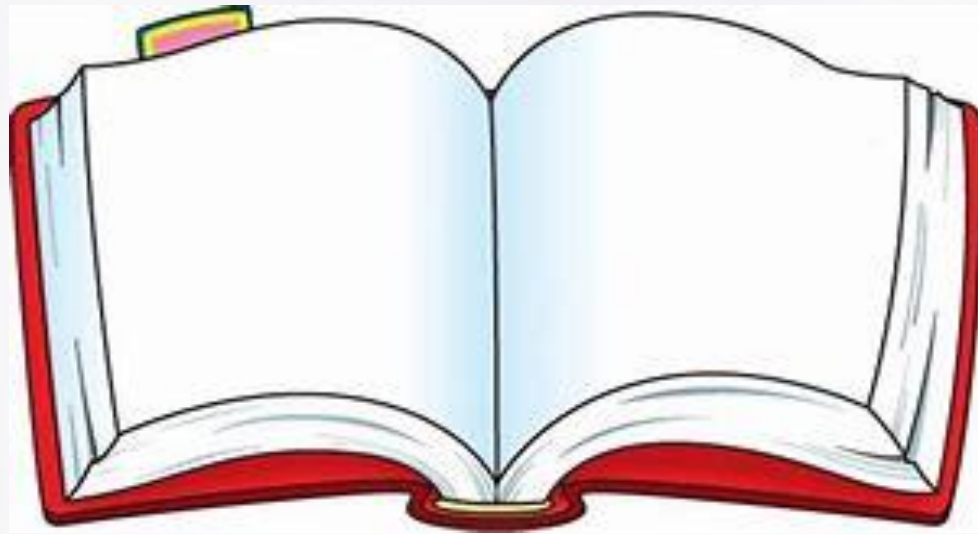

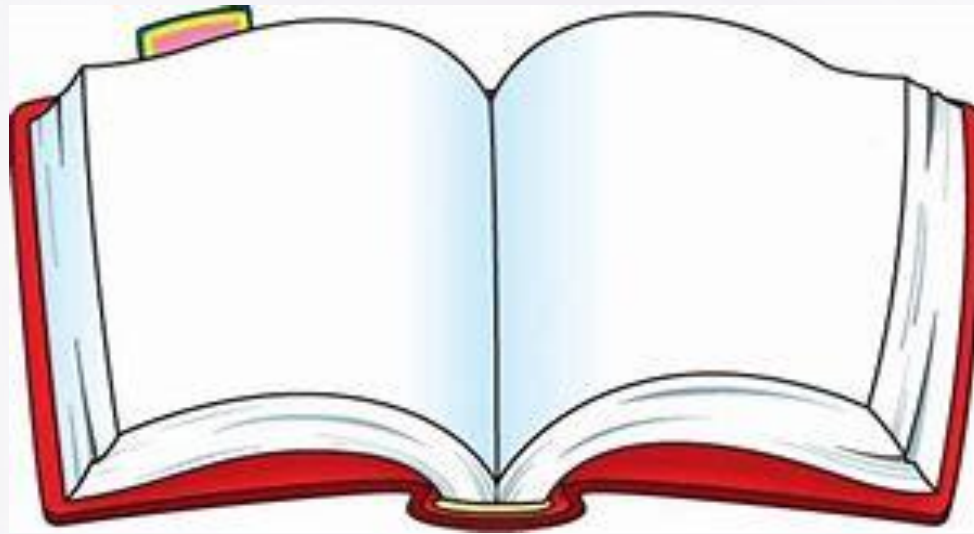
**God has allowed each

DEFINITION OF RUBBERNECKING

Rubbernecking is the act of staring at something of interest. The term rubbernecking refers to the physical act of craning one's neck, performed in order to get a better view. Rubberneck has been described as a human trait that is associated with morbid curiosity.

Rubbernecking is the disease of the New Testament church: people wanting to get close enough to see, but not close enough to get involved.

Acts 3:1–2 (NASB95)

1 Now Peter and John were going up to the temple at the ninth *hour*, the hour of prayer. **2** And a man who had been lame from his mother's womb was being carried along, whom they used to set down every day at the gate of the temple which is called Beautiful, in order to beg alms of those who were entering the temple.

Acts 3:4–7 (NASB95)

4 But Peter, along with John, fixed his gaze on him and said, “Look at us!” **5** And he *began* to give them his attention, expecting to receive something from them. **6** But Peter said, “I do not possess silver and gold, but what I do have I give to you: In the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene—walk!” **7** And seizing him by the right hand, he raised him up; and immediately his feet and his ankles were strengthened.

David was willing.

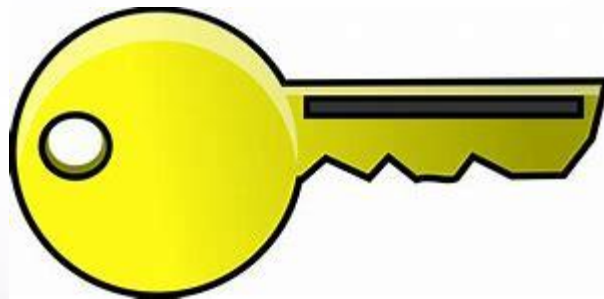
Peter was willing.

9 to another faith by the same Spirit, and to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit,
10 and to another the effecting of miracles, and to another prophecy, and to another the distinguishing of spirits, to another *various* kinds of tongues, and to another the interpretation of tongues.
