

DISCIPLINE IS THE PRICE WE PAY FOR FREEDOM

With the weather finally changing, many of us are planning to get outside more, exercise, and take off some of the weight we've "attracted" over these long winter months! Think about *the value of discipline* in various areas of your life:

- -Exercise and diet regularly and you'll probably live better and longer.
- -Focus 100 % on one task at a time, and generally you'll be less frazzled.



For example, when we:

 Take the time and effort to abide in God's word we are liberated from the tyranny of sin's bondage:

"If you continue in my word...you will know the truth and the truth shall make you free." (John 8:31, 32)

• **Joyfully endure trials**, God is *then* able to forge within us that inner quality of steel belted strength that results in **personal freedom**:

"When all kinds of trials and temptations crowd into your lives my brothers, don't resent them as intruders, but welcome them as friends. Realize that they have come to produce in you the quality of <u>endurance</u>. But let the process go on and you will realize that you have become men of mature character with the right kind of independence." (James 1:2-4, Phillips Translation)

• Gain control over the dictates of our lower nature we are insured longevity in effective service: Everyone who competes in the games exercises self-control in all things...Therefore I run in such a way, as not without aim...I buffet my body and make it my slave, lest possibly, after I have preached to others, I myself should be disqualified (literally: "rendered ineffective"). ...for by what a man is overcome, by this he is enslaved. (I Corinthians 9:25-27; II Peter 2:19)

Paul speaks forcefully to this issue of discipline in stating,

Exercise daily in God - no spiritual flabbiness, please! Workouts in the gymnasium are useful, but a <u>disciplined life in God</u> is far more so, making you fit both today and forever. (I Timothy 4:7, The Message)

I need to ask myself whether I AM WILLING TO PAY THE PRICE OF <u>DISCIPLINE</u> TO ACHIEVE <u>FREEDOM</u>. The toll exacted upon me for the lack of discipline will, in the long run far exceed the price I now pay for freedom through discipline!

May you experience God's freedom through his grace of discipline!

CONFERENCE CONNECTIONS

All United Methodist churches are connected through shared mission and ministry and united in their efforts to grow in love of God and neighbor, reach new people, and heal a broken world. Check out these news tidbits from the Minnesota Annual Conference, which serves all 360 United Methodist churches in the state.

- Bishop Ough: 'The Risen Christ is Coming': Christ is risen! Christ is risen, indeed! Easter is about Jesus standing among us in every circumstance, in every place, Bishop Bruce R. Ough said in his Easter message. "Easter is about Jesus reaching out to us across the great dark abysses of despair, doubt, and death, and saying, 'Peace be with you.' Easter is about realizing that our story, our journey, with Jesus is beginning rather than ending. Easter is about God making it irrefutably clear that 'God's dwelling place is here with humankind' (Revelation 21:2-3)."
- Your generosity makes a difference: Last year, you helped one church launch, one church expand to a second location, nine churches start one of two key revitalization processes, and 35 churches create new ministries through congregational development grants. That's just the beginning of what was made possible through apportionments, the share each local church pays to support international, national, and local missions. Locally, apportionments help fund new churches, training opportunities for clergy and laity, grants to support churches' ministry and outreach efforts, the conference camping ministry, and much more. Thank you for your giving, which helps us reach new people for Christ and live into John Wesley's belief that "the world is my parish."

BRIGHT SPOTS IN OUR MIDST

- MN United Methodists advocate for Liberian refugees: Thousands of Liberian refugees who have been legally living in the U.S. for years are facing the possibility of being deported in 2019. Several Minnesota United Methodists are working to change that through advocacy in Washington, D.C. and locally. Wynfred Russell, who worships at Brooklyn UMC in Brooklyn Park and North UMC in Minneapolis, and three clergy are actively pushing for a path to citizenship for those with Deferred Enforced Departure (DED) status, and Brooklyn UMC has brought in volunteer lawyers to consult with impacted Liberians. Meanwhile, Bishop Bruce R. Ough has called on the Trump administration and all United Methodists to see the face of Christ in the refugee.
- 200 youth explore faith, call through retreats: More than 200 Minnesota United Methodist youth explored their unique call and what it means to commit their lives to Christ at two separate March retreats—a Confirmation gathering at Koronis Ministries in Paynesville and a Southern Prairie District event at a camp near lowa. "It was a way to really take some time apart and think about who they are in relationship with Jesus," said Rev. Tony Fink, who serves Fairmont UMC and brought youth to the Confirmation retreat. "They can build on this for the rest of their life."
