There has been new clarity and focus in serving others and sharing Jesus in word and deed. The SMT was created, the constitution rewritten (thanks Gloria!) and Follow Jesus – Reach | Grow | Go flowed out of it. Like never before in our 100 year history, we've opened our hearts to God's Word through a greatly expanded Life Group ministry and become engaged in God's Mission both personally and together with community partners.

All the events of our 100th celebration (thanks Paula!) had deep missiological and mission emphasis threads flowing through them. It is a joy to witness Trinity moving forward in outreach as we live out our call to *pray earnestly*, see what Jesus is doing in the here and now and then step out in faith and join Him on His Mission in real time. And we've only just begun.

The recent Community Thanksgiving Dinner Nov. 19th (thanks Pastor Bruce!) may not have produced high numbers but the quality of people who showed up and their openness to return for worship more than made up for it. This year many more personal invitations were handed out member-to-friend. Personalized invitations were also shared with neighbors north, south and west of the church property. These invitations touched hearts and raised our image in the community -- even if those invited didn't show up for the dinner. For many of them, this was the first contact they've had with Trinity *where they were invited to participate as adults*. Many did show up and enjoyed the delicious dinner and warm conversations. Hats off to all the cooks, servers and cleaners who made this event possible!

One new mission outreach development for 2018 is the New Movers postcards now being sent to new neighbors. Every month we send out 100+ invitation postcards to families who've recently moved to Hillsboro with a "Welcome to Hillsboro" message and a warm invitation to visit Trinity. Having the New Movers postcards up and running means that when South Hillsboro comes online in 2018 and 2019, we're ready to send invitations to our new neighbors to "Come and See" "Know God" and share in the spiritual riches God's Spirit has poured into Trinity during the last 100 years. These postcards also serve as excellent tools for you to personally share a warm invitation to anyone who's recently moved into your neck of the woods.

Another shipment was made October 27, 2017, this time we packed sixty four quilts.

It is encouraging to us watching the shelves in the storage room get filled with completed quilts. We worked 24 Wednesdays this period and continue completing 3 to 4 quilts each work day. Each quilt back is a new twin size flat sheet, purchased at Fred Meyer. Batting is purchased from Oklee Quilting Supply in Oklee, MN.

Thank you to those who purchased quilts. Those purchases provide the funds for sheets, batting and shipping costs. Also, thank you to the donor of additional funds needed for shipping from the warehouse to final desti-

nation. LWR has made it possible for us to learn final destination of quilts. We are tracking one box, thanks to Amollia Clarke for doing the program. (We appreciated her expertise for six months until she took a full-time paying job.)

"UNTO US A CHILD IS BORN"





Our regular Worship schedule returns on Sunday, January 7th, 2018. Below are some pictures of our Advent decorating this past Sunday.




