

COUNCIL First Evangelical Lutheran Church **Oakland**, Nebraska

The church council met September 11, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. In attendance were Greg Johnson, Sam Schmidt, Sandy Husar, Jim Pelan, Linda Jones, Jon Seagren, Mona Tanksley, Tom Meyer and Susan Mulder. Also in attendance were Pastor Eldal and visitor, Beverly Peterson.

After devotions were given by Jon, the minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. Pastor presented his report for the months of July and August.

The Treasurer's report was reviewed and discussed noting that through August, expenses exceeded income by \$4317.52. The report was accepted.

Beverly Peterson addressed the council regarding the sound system reporting that some members are having problems hearing even with the use of the new hearing devices. She asked that we look into what can be done to alleviate this problem. She also complimented the youth on the work projects that they have done in our community this summer. The council discussed various options for improving the sound and decided that we will order a new headset for Pastor to use in hopes that that will improve the audio. We will also have the ushers close the folding doors between the sanctuary and annex to keep the sound from drifting.

Old Business: It was reported that some Sundays we have run out of rolls to serve after the service and Sandy agreed to adjust our order. Problems have been encountered with filling the big coffee pot and a discussion ensued regarding installing a new sink with a faucet that has a spray nozzle. Pastor reported that the Dorcas ladies have discussed adding some cabinets and counters in the north room to improve the storage needs. Linda agreed to discuss the plans with Lela Heineman.

The Property Committee reported that the tree on the north lawn of the church that was struck by lightning needs to come down. Greg and Jim have agreed to take it down this week.

New Business: Kylie Penke will now be part of the worship committee representing the Praise Service. The Praise service was discussed stating that we are trying to get more people involved. We have been trying various types of services as a way to reach out to all members. The ideas talked about at this meeting will be shared with the Evangelism Committee.

The Evangelism Committee met this evening and they have compiled a calendar of youth events. This was distributed and published in the newsletter. If anyone is available to help with youth events, sign up sheets are available on the bulletin board. Other items discussed were the milestones for the youth, the idea of getting a welcome banner at the back of the church, the idea of getting a young couples group together, the 500th anniversary of the Reformation and getting more helpers for the pub after ball games.

Pastor reported that the annual LCMC meeting is October 8-11 in Minneapolis and he will share the annual reports he brings back from that meeting. He asked if anyone else was interested in going, to let him know. It was decided that we will have a dinner on October 29, Reformation Day, to celebrate the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. Linda, Sandy, Susan and Mona will organize the meal and more information will be available as we get closer to the date. Jon and Janelle Seagren were thanked for all of the work they have done on the upstairs Sunday School room. There being no further business, the meeting closed with all saying the Lord's Prayer.

The next meeting will be October 2 at 7:00 p.m.






