Most of all, we can be thankful that we can experience a relationship with this God through his Son, Jesus.


In this Thanksgiving season may we at times find ourselves welling up in thankfulness towards God for all of his goodness to us.

First Evangelical Lutheran Church Oakland, Nebraska

The church council met October 3, 2016 at 7:00 pm. In attendance were Greg Johnson, Jim Pelan, Cheryl Denker, Rachel Wise, Sam Schmidt, Sandy Husar, Carole Johnson and Mona Tanksley. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

<u>The Treasurer's Report</u> was reviewed after which there was a discussion on ways to decrease waste in the church and save money. It was decided to ask Audrey Unwin, Treasurer, to come to the next meeting to discuss expenses. It was noted that currently through September expenses have exceeded income by over \$14,000.

Old Business: Greg reported that a great group of volunteers helped with the demolition of a wall between two Sunday school rooms. Max Christensen will be coming to install the electrical outlets, lights, etc. Jim reported on the bids he has received for the replacement of the southwest door downstairs. After reviewing the options, a motion was made by Sandy Husar to accept the bid from Lindy Glass for the replacement of the door in the southwest entry for a cost of \$1742.45 and to have Larry Shelly paint the door at a cost of \$160 using money from the memorial fund. Motion seconded by Cheryl Denker and carried. It was also decided to have Larry Shelly repair and paint the area on the west entrance of the building where it is chipping away. It was reported that the screen that is torn upstairs is not able to be removed. We will have Lindy Glass reps look at it while they are here to install the door. We discussed options on covering the window wells, but have decided to wait until next year's budget to proceed with any work.

<u>New Business:</u> There was discussion about having a cleanup day at church to see if we can dispose of some items that are no longer needed. It was suggested to have the leader of each group present at the time as they would know what should be kept. Greg will compile a list of group leaders, set a date and plan to get this accomplished before Christmas. Council members offering to help are Rachel, Carole and Jim.

The Evangelism Committee are planning an outreach event on October 16 at the Harvest Moon pumpkin patch. Family members are encouraged to attend this outing

Greg will contact Clay Olson to check on the status of the air conditioning and furnace installation project.

The next meeting will be November 7 at 7:00 p.m.
