A few Sundays ago we read in our gospel lesson the poignant story of a demonic man whom Jesus healed.

The passage said this man was often chained and lived in the tombs. We also read that Jesus traveled across the Sea of Galilee to the region where this man lived, cast out the demons and healed him. He then sat at the feet of Jesus in his right mind.

The demons were sent into some nearby pigs, which then ran into the sea and were drowned. The people in the town then asked Jesus to leave, which he did. When the healed man asked to go with him, Jesus told the man to tell others what God had done for him.

In the end, Jesus healed just this one man in that visit, but of course, he was worth the trip.

The passage touched my heart in many ways. It said to me that Jesus cares about each one of us individually. We are "worth the trip." It reminded me that Jesus can set us free from the tombs we sometimes find ourselves living in; perhaps tombs of discouragement, fear or other inner struggles. It encouraged me to remember we can sit at the feet of Jesus and experience his company and peace. We can then tell others what he has done for us.

I am glad we have a God who cares for us personally, and who can heal our inner struggles and give us his peace.

As we trust in Jesus, may we sit at the feet of Jesus this summer and experience all he has for us.

First Evangelical Lutheran Church Oakland, Nebraska

The church council met June 6, 2016 at 7:30 p.m. with the following persons present: Greg Johnson, Jim Pelan Carole Johnson, Jon Seagren, Sam Schmidt, Sandy Husar, Mona Tanksley, Karl Lundquist, Rachel Wise and Pastor Eldal. After devotions were given by Mona, the meeting was called to order and the minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

<u>The Profit and Loss statement</u> was reviewed noting that through May the income has exceeded expenses by \$1578. Pastor presented his report for activities in the month of May. He reported that this year the attendance at the monthly youth pizza event has been the greatest ever.

Old Business: We discussed the purchase of individual listening devices for hearing impaired and Greg agreed to check out what other companies have to offer. The heating and cooling project was discussed noting that we have received two bids. A motion was made by Sandy Husar that we accept the bid from Olson Heating and Plumbing to replace our heating and cooling systems. Motion seconded by J. Seagren. An amendment to the motion was made by R. Wise that we take money from the parsonage fund to pay for this project and repay the amount borrowed using funds from the Outreach Fund within a five-year period. The motion was unanimously carried. After discussion, it was decided to schedule a special meeting for July 17 to seek the congregation's approval of this project. All members will be notified per mail and by announcement at worship services. In the meantime, we will check to see if there is any financing available through the furnace/air conditioning company and check on the warranty given. The exterminator has checked out the building, but Greg has not received any report of his findings to date. It was felt the new outside lights are working well. J. Seagren reported on the project of removing a wall between two Sunday school rooms. He learned that it was not a load bearing wall, but will check with a contractor once more before work begins to remove it. Volunteers will be needed to assist with this project. Also Jon will check on the status of insulation in that part of the building.

<u>The Evangelism Committee</u> met recently and they reported that a Praise Service will be scheduled for June 12, July 10 and August 14. R. Wise reported on the next steps with the faith milestones noting that a kickoff is planned for Sunday School, youth and volunteers. A calendar is planned that will list activities such as the pub, youth pizza day, youth meetings, etc. Some family activities are also being planned.

<u>New Business:</u> The property committee reported that two window well covers have been broken. Options were discussed and J. Pelan agreed to research ideas to replace these. The idea of purchasing an AED to have onsite was discussed. M. Tanksley will look into the cost of purchasing a unit.

Volunteers have provided rolls and treats for the coffee hour on Sunday morning during the time Gerald Groene has been unable to provide rolls. It was felt that we should do something special for Gerald to express appreciation for all he has done for our church. The LCMC conference is October 2-5 in Denver. Two delegates will attend from our congregation, but if anyone else is interested in attending they may do so. Communion for June and July will be moved to the third weekend of the month. The white altar cloth was noted to be soiled so it will be taken to be dry cleaned.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned with all saying the Lord's Prayer. The next meeting will be July 5 at 7:30 p.m.






