Wonderfully, these teachings which were freshly brought to the forefront in the Reformation can still be the central truths of our lives, as we daily live in God's grace, though faith in Jesus, while we base this faith on the solid foundation of God's Word.

May the truths of the Reformation be the foundation of our lives.



COUNCIL First Evangelical Lutheran Church Oakland, Nebraska

The church council met September 8, 2015 with Cheryl Denker calling the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Also in attendance were Rachel Wise, Jan Wiltse, Jon Seagren, Sam Schmidt, Jim Pelan, Greg Johnson, Roger Moderow, Sandy Husar and Mona Tanksley. Absent were Carl Magnusson and Kylie Penke.

Pastor presented his report of August activities.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and a motion was made by Jon, to accept them. Motion seconded by Sam and carried. Sandy Husar read the devotions. The Profit and Loss statement for August and for the year to date were reviewed noting a loss of \$2800.00 year to date.

The Evangelism committee met prior to the council meeting and Rachel summarized their activities. The sign in book that will be used for attendees to sign at each service was shown and plans are to start using them this fall. The ushers will be instructed in what their responsibility will be regarding these sign in sheets. It was reported that a book mark will be printed giving information on our church and placed in the Chamber of Commerce welcome packets that are given to new residents of Oakland. A calendar will be available on the north bulletin board in the multipurpose room where members can sign up to volunteer with activities in the church. These activities include providing a meal for the confirmation and high school youth during their Wednesday night meetings, helping with the pub after high school games, assisting with the monthly pizza lunch, etc. Pastor discussed plans for the confirmation class regarding meetings and service projects noting he will be meeting with the confirmands' parents to share information.

Cheryl reported for the **Music Committee** noting that choir resumes this week and Cindy Blanc has agreed to be the accompanist.

The Property Committee reported on the maintenance items that have been done recently. A bid has been sought for painting the steps and some other areas where paint has chipped. It was reported that the television for the multipurpose room should be arriving soon. All are asked to please put any leftover food items away so as not to invite rodents. The lawn will be leveled and grass planted where the new sprinkler system has been installed. Discussion ensured regarding getting some new lighter weight tables for the multipurpose room. A decision was made to purchase 7 lifetime tables for the multipurpose room.

Old Business: Some applications have been received for the media aide position and interviews will soon take place. There was more discussion about having a second contemporary service in the months where there is a fifth Sunday and having the youth assist with this service.

New Business: After discussing options, it was agreed to go ahead and expand the phone service at church. This system will especially help in making sure messages get to the intended recipient efficiently. Cheryl presented information about a "shoebox" project where items can be collected and sent overseas to students. We will look into this further.

The meeting adjourned with Pastor leading the group in the Lord's Prayer. The next meeting will be October 5 at 7:30 p.m. with devotions - Mona Tanksley.

Include the following items in each Baby Care Kit: Two lightweight cotton t-shirts, Two long- or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet), Two receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, up to 52" square, Four cloth diapers, flat fold preferred, One jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, *or include a baby cap*, Two pairs of socks, One hand towel, dark color recommended, Two or three bath-size bars of soap equaling up to 8-9 oz, any brand, in original wrapping, Two diaper pins or large safety pins.

- Please include sizes between 6 and 24 months. Varying the sizes of the clothing items included will make the Baby Care Kit useful as the baby grows.
- Sweaters may be knitted or crocheted from leftover yarn, or made from heavy double knits or fleece. Select a pattern that suits your skill level. Preferred styles have buttons or ties down the front.
- If knitting or crocheting receiving blankets, including one knitted/crocheted blanket and one flannel blanket will provide maximum versatility.
- > Onesies can be cut and hemmed or serged to make a simple t-shirt.
- ➢ Gowns, rompers or top/pants sets can be substituted for sleepers.




