Soon many of the ministries of this fellowship will begin again for the fall and the goal of these ministries will be that we be fed spiritually, as we experience Jesus as our bread of life.


As we partake in these ministries may our souls be fed as we trust in Jesus.

The church council met August 4, 2015 and President Cheryl Denker called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. Also in attendance were Jim Pelan, Greg Johnson, Jon Seagren, Jan Wiltse, Sandy Husar, Rachel Wise, Sam Schmidt, Roger Moderow, Kylie Penke and Mona Tanksley. Pastor Eldal was also present. After devotions were given by Cheryl, Pastor gave his report for June and July activities. The minutes of the June meeting were read and a motion to accept them was made by Jon Seagren. Motion seconded by Sandy Husar and carried.

The financial report was not available at this time and once it is complete, it will be sent out to council members.

The Evangelism Committee met prior to this meeting and Rachel summarized their activities. Members will be encouraged to utilize the Right Now media that is available via the internet. Kylie reported on the youth gatherings that have been held during the summer noting that plans are for these to continue throughout the fall. A calendar of events will be posted on the bulletin board in the multipurpose room along with a sign-up sheet listing activities members may choose to volunteer to assist with. The committee is working on ideas to get the youth involved with church services.

Cheryl noted that Brian Bohn has agreed to once again be the choir director. Practice will resume September 9. We are looking to move forward with the sign-in tablets in the pews beginning this fall.

The Property Committee reported that a dehumidifier has been purchased to replace the one by the organ. It was reported that the sprinkler system has been installed northeast of the parking lot. It was noted that the lawn is being mowed weekly. Items needing attention around the building include the loose railing on the west, uneven concrete steps on the west, chipped paint on the exterior, some refinishing of hand railings, etc. A notice will be placed in the bulletin and the Spire to see if volunteers would be willing to help with some of these projects. Problems continue with the air conditioner and the fence surrounding it and we continue to seek a solution. Jim reported that he had met with Jason Parcel and discussed options for the television that we have talked about installing in the multipurpose room. Options for paying for it were considered. After discussion, a motion was made by Rachel to purchase a 60 inch television, an external DVD player and wiring using funds that are available from various sources. The motion was seconded by Greg and unanimously carried.

The council thanked Dan Tanksley for painting the lines on the street for parking spaces.

Old Business: The part time media specialist position is still available and the personnel committee will meet and discuss the hiring process. In other business it was noted that we will seed the lawn where needed.



These will be due November 1. Great time to take advantage of Garage sales and store sales too!! Include the following items in each Baby Care Kit: Two lightweight cotton t-shirts, Two long- or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet), Two receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, up to 52" square, Four cloth diapers, flat fold preferred, One jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, *or include a baby cap*, Two pairs of socks, One hand towel, dark color recommended, Two or three bath-size bars of soap equaling up to 8-9 oz, any brand, in original wrapping, Two diaper pins or large safety pins.

Please include sizes between 6 and 24 months. Varying the sizes of the clothing items included will make the Baby Care Kit useful as the baby grows.



- Sweaters may be knitted or crocheted from leftover yarn, or made from heavy double knits or fleece. Select a pattern that suits your skill level. Preferred styles have buttons or ties down the front.
- If knitting or crocheting receiving blankets, including one knitted/crocheted blanket and one flannel blanket will provide maximum versatility.
- > Onesies can be cut and hemmed or serged to make a simple t-shirt.
- > Gowns, rompers or top/pants sets can be substituted for sleepers.


