In observing Trinity Sunday we remembered God is three in one and that there can be mystery to this, which can remind us that there can be mystery in our faith at times. God has revealed much about himself and our world. In fact, he has revealed all that we need to know to understand our world, what he has done for us, and how we can enter into a relationship with him through faith in Jesus. Yet, as Paul writes in II Corinthians 4, perplexity can arise in our lives. However, when it does we can freshly entrust our lives to Jesus and know that he will be with us.

The thought of God being three in one can also remind us of his awesomeness and power. It can fill me with humility and cause me to freshly surrender my life to him.

When we think of the triune God, we can also know God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit live in unity and right relationship with one another. Following this example we too can seek to live in right relationship with others.

As we contemplate the members of the Trinity, we know that in some ways they play different roles in our lives. Although the Bible says all things were made through Jesus, we also think of the Father as the one who created heaven and earth. We know Jesus would enter our world to be our Redeemer, and we know the Holy Spirit would come to be a helper to us in the Christian life. We can be reminded that just as they minister to us in different ways, so God has given us different gifts and abilities and we can minster in various ways to others.



There will not be services on June 21 due to the Community Services during the Swedish Festival.





The church council met May 4, 2015 at

7:30 p.m. with the following persons present: Cheryl Denker, Sam Schmidt, Carl Magnusson, Mona Tanksley, Greg Johnson, Kylie Penke, Rachel Wise, Jan Wiltse, Jim Pelan, Roger Moderow, Sandy Husar and Pastor Mark Eldal.

The meeting began with Rachel giving devotions. Pastor presented his report for the month of April discussing his activities. The minutes of the April meeting were read and a motion was made by C. Magnusson to accept them. Motion seconded by K. Penke and carried.

The Evangelism Committee report was given by Rachel Wise who reported on the committee's recent meeting. She stated that for youth activities a family event was held last Sunday for the third graders and their families. There are some activities planned for youth during the summer. It was noted that the confirmation class indicated that they wanted to continue to meet on Wednesday evenings. More information will follow when plans are finalized. There was discussion on having some training for the greeters when welcoming visitors and/or new members. Our church will have information placed in the city welcome packets inviting those new to the area to worship with us. The idea of having a video on our church website was discussed. Social ministry was discussed and ways to use social media to reach people. Also discussed was having someone available to work as a media intern.

Cheryl reported on a recent meeting with staff to discuss job roles and job descriptions. The idea of hiring another person to serve as a backup/media intern was discussed. Cheryl and Rachel will meet and determine a budget, write a job description, determine hours needed and compile a list of duties for which this person would be responsible. This will be discussed at the next council meeting.

Cheryl reported that Ruth Wallerstedt has agreed to line up special music for the summer services.

The Property Committee report was given by J. Pelan who noted that the manger has been taken down and stored, the closet door and faucets have been repaired and the fence surrounding the air conditioning unit has been fixed to allow better air circulation. He also presented two quotes for a television set for the multipurpose room. Next we will check into the cost of wiring the TV set. A quote of \$1600 has been received from Sean Linder for a sprinkler system that would water the grass on the north side of the parking lot. A motion was made by Sandy Husar, seconded by Carl Magnusson that we purchase the sprinkler system for \$1600 and then reseed the area with grass seed. Motion carried. In other business it was reported that the broken window well cover has been repaired and the cracks in the sidewalk have been ground down. The parking space lines on the south side of the church are in need of painting. We will check with Dan Tanksley to see about getting this done. We discussed Sunday School rooms and the idea of combining the junior high and high school classes and options to have a room large enough for a class this size.

<u>Old Business</u>: Clothing items have been collected and these items will soon be delivered. Cheryl will check with the food bank to see who is to pick up the items we have collected. We continue to work on updating the list of members.

<u>New Business:</u> It was reported that the computer in the office is not working well so it was decided to check into the cost of a new one.
