## Churches will be Ineffective when:

# 1. <u>Self-deception</u> goes unchecked.

<sup>18</sup> Do not deceive yourselves. If any of you think you are wise by the standards of this age, you should become "fools" so that you may become wise. <sup>19</sup> For the wisdom of this world is foolishness in God's sight. As it is written: "He catches the wise in their craftiness." <sup>20</sup> and again, "The Lord knows that the thoughts of the wise are futile." 1 Corinthians 3:18-20

# 2. Personal <u>preferences</u> divide the Church.

<sup>21</sup> So then, no more boasting about human leaders! All things are yours. 1 Corinthians 3:21

# 3. Personal Preferences <u>limit</u> God's Wisdom and Power for the Church.

All things are yours, <sup>22</sup> whether Paul or Apollos or Cephas or the world or life or death or the present or the future — all are yours, <sup>23</sup> and you are of Christ, and Christ is of God. 1 Corinthians 3:22-23

# Churches will be Effective when it's members:

#### 1. are <u>servants</u>

<sup>1</sup> This, then, is how you ought to regard us: as servants of Jesus Christ. . . 1 Corinthians 4:1a

# ♦ Hypēretēs (hüp-ā-re'-tās): servant; slave; bottom dweller

## 2. are <u>stewards</u> of Jesus' commission.

<sup>1</sup> This, then, is how you ought to regard us: as servants of Jesus Christ and as those entrusted with the mysteries God has revealed. 1 Corinthians 4:1

## • Oikonomos (oi-ko-no'-mos): servant; steward; houseservant; manager of the house

## 3. are <u>faithful</u> to Jesus above all else.

<sup>2</sup> Now it is required that those who have been given a trust must prove faithful. 1 Corinthians 4:2

# 4. seek Jesus' approval only.

<sup>3</sup> I care very little if I am judged by you or by any human court; indeed, I do not even judge myself. <sup>4</sup> My conscience is clear, but that does not make me innocent. It is the Lord who judges me. <sup>5</sup> Therefore judge nothing before the appointed time; wait until the Lord comes. He will bring to light what is hidden in darkness and will expose the motives of the heart. At that time each will receive their praise from God.

1 Corinthians 4:3-5

- 7. What standards do we often use to evaluate God's servants today? Why does Paul "care very little" about such judgments? (4:3-5)
- 8. How may you help PRCC avoid Paul's 3 Warnings? Of the four (4) things Pastor Shawn shared, How may you help PRCC remain effective?
