**1. I am called into Christ.**

...called you out of darkness into his wonderful light. 1 Peter 2:9b

**7 BENEFITS OF OUR SALVATION**

**(a) we are united with Christ.**

<sup>4</sup> As you come to him the living Stone — rejected by humans but chosen by God and precious to him — <sup>5</sup> you also, like living stones, are being built. . . . 1 Peter 2:4-5a

“See, I lay a stone in Zion, a chosen and precious cornerstone, . . . .”

1 Peter 2:6a

**(b) we have fellowship with Christ.**

<sup>5</sup> you also, like living stones, are being built into a spiritual house. . . . 1 Peter 2:5b

**(c) we have access are being built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood, . . . .** 1 Peter 2:5c

**(d) our sacrifices are acceptable to God.**

<sup>5</sup> you also, like living stones, are being built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood, offering spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. 1 Peter 2:5d

**(e) we have confidence before God.**

<sup>6</sup> “See, I lay a stone in Zion, a chosen and precious cornerstone, and the one who trusts in him will never be put to shame.” 1 Peter 2:6

**(f) we belong to Jesus.**

<sup>9</sup> But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God’s special possession, . . . . 1 Peter 2:9a

**(g) we receive mercy in Christ.**

<sup>10</sup> Once you were not a people, but now you are the people of God; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy. 1 Peter 2:10

**2. I am called to tell the world what Christ has done.**

<sup>9</sup> . . . that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light. 1 Peter 2:9b

**3. I am called to live morally good among my unbelieving neighbors so they may see Jesus.**

<sup>11</sup> Dear friends, I urge you, as foreigners and exiles, to abstain from sinful desires, which wage war against your soul. <sup>12</sup> Live such good lives among the pagans that, though they accuse you of doing wrong, they may see your good deeds and glorify God on the day he visits us.

<sup>15</sup> For it is God’s will that by doing good you should silence the ignorant talk of foolish people. 1 Peter 2:11-12, 15

**◆ Kalos (kä-lo’s): good;honest; beautiful; excellent;  
beautiful because of purity of heart and life; so praiseworthy**
