

Mark 6:45-46 (NASB)

⁴⁵ Immediately Jesus made His disciples get into the boat and go ahead of *Him* to the other side to Bethsaida, while He Himself was sending the crowd away. ⁴⁶ After bidding them farewell, He left for the mountain to pray.

Mark 6:47-48 (NASB)

47 When it was evening, the boat was in the middle of the sea, and He was alone on the land. 48 Seeing them straining at the oars, for the wind was against them, at about the fourth watch of the night He *came to them, walking on the sea; and He intended to pass by them.

Mark 6:49-50 (NASB)

⁴⁹ But when they saw Him walking on the sea, they supposed that it was a ghost, and cried out; ⁵⁰ for they all saw Him and were terrified. But immediately He spoke with them and *said to them, "Take courage; it is I, do not be afraid."

Mark 6:51-52 (NASB)

Then He got into the boat with them, and the wind stopped; and they were utterly astonished, for they had not gained any insight from the *incident of* the loaves, but their heart was hardened.

Mark 6:56 (NASB)

Wherever He entered villages, or cities, or countryside, they were laying the sick in the market places, and imploring Him that they might just touch the fringe of His cloak; and as many as touched it were being cured.

Mark 6:46 (NASB)

46 After bidding them farewell, He left for the mountain to pray.

Praying after service is always wise.
Successful service, recognition, esteem, praise, honor, crowd wanted to make Jesus King.

God is our source, rest, excitement, deliverance, strength, motivation, object of worship, source of renewal.

Proverbs 16:18 (NASB)

Pride *goes* before destruction, And a haughty spirit before stumbling.

If you allow the flesh and a haughty spirit to take you to your other side, instead of submitting yourself to the Holy Spirit with and humble spirit, you will go to places you would never want to go to.

Mark 6:47-48 (NASB)

Faith is being sure of what you hope for and it is the evidence of things not seen.

- The boat was in the middle of the sea, a place when fear took over that you could not have jumped out of the boat and ran to shore.
- Only in the deep will you see the miracles of the Lord.

- When it was evening, in the middle of the sea, a place where you feel all alone, there was a force against them, they were straining, going to your other side is never easy.
- Fear says you are alone, faith says God has your back.
- · He was going to pass them by to reassure them.

Mark 6:49-50 (NASB)

Him walking on the sea, they supposed that it was a ghost, and cried out; for they all saw Him and were terrified. But immediately He spoke with them and *said to them, "Take courage; it is I, do not be afraid."

When the Lord takes you to your other side there are three things to notice form this scripture.

- First their toil was long.
- Second their fear was horrifying.
- Third their cry was desperate.
- But they forgot who He truly was: the *Great I*Am

Mark 6:51-52 (NASB)

Then He got into the boat with them, and the wind stopped; and they were utterly astonished, for they had not gained any insight from the incident of the loaves, but their heart was hardened.

When Jesus is in your boat, He will give to you a peace that will surpass all human understanding.

John 16:33 (NASB)

"These things I have spoken to you, so that in Me you may have peace. In the world you have tribulation, but take courage; I have overcome the world."

Jesus told them to get in the boat and go to the other side, didn't tell them that it would be easy, they just witnessed the miracle of feeding the 5000 and they were horrified.

Mark 6:52 (NASB)

for they had not gained any insight from the *incident of* the loaves, but their heart was hardened.

To get to the other side will take a major step of faith, knowing that all things are possible and that we can bind and loose and do the same things that Jesus did.

Mark 6:56 (NASB)

Wherever He entered villages, or cities, or countryside, they were laying the sick in the market places, and imploring Him that they might just touch the fringe of His cloak; and as many as touched it were being cured.

It has been stated that in the days of the clipper ships when they ran into a storm they would heist the sails, stop fighting the storm, and allow the wind to take control.

Scripture tells us that the disciples were headed for Bethsaida but were blown off course to Gennesaret, it was there the disciples once again witnessed the miracles of God.

Stop fighting your storm, allow the Holy Spirit to take control, because to accomplish God's purpose you might have to be blown off course to get to God's other side, not yours, because when God is on your side all things are possible.
