<sup>36</sup> Leaving the crowd, they \*took Him along with them in the boat, just as He was; and other boats were with Him.




## Mark 4:37-38 (NASB)

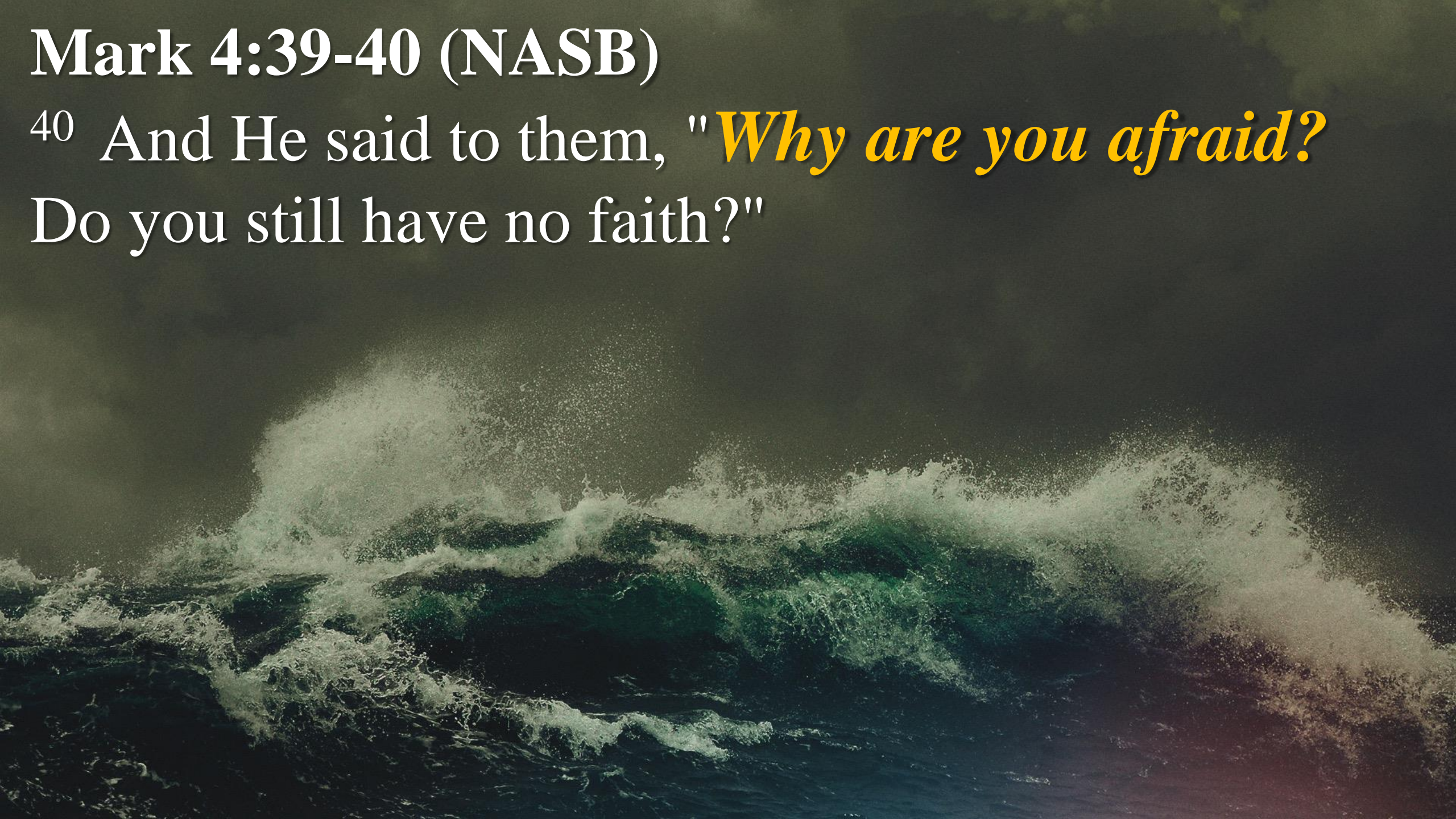
