

Jesus says the most important activity for us as human beings is to "…love the Lord your God with all your heart and all your soul and ALL YOUR MIND. This is the great and first commandment" (*emphasis/CAPS added*, Matthew 22:37-38, *ESV*).

Our congregation was established in July 1871, when the town of Windom was in its infancy. The early settlers that became our congregation met in the first building that was constructed in Windom, which was a hardware store. We were literally the first church in Windom.

Survey Results!


We recently sent surveys to all the congregation, asking for your views on when to return to indoor worship, and other related items. We sent out 156 surveys, and we

received 109 of them back from you, which is a strong representation. Thank you! Here are results from your input; they include an average of all age groups unless noted otherwise...

- The great majority of you would like to return to worship with precautions as soon as government allows, over 80%.
- Many of you (but less than half on each item) want to return when local businesses are open, local restaurant seating returns, distancing rules are lifted, and when the number of Covid-19 cases near us is small. In regard to the number of cases: as of our publishing date, June 26th, there are 8 'cases' in Cottonwood County that require isolation (they don't state how many of these people are sick). Our county's updates are available daily at www.dvhhs.org.
- Most of you who are in a small group would like to attend as soon as they are available.
- Most of you (about 70% of respondents) are comfortable returning to a sanctuary that is half full or more, with distancing.
- Most are willing to come at a different time, if needed, with just a few that can't, and a small number not sure.
- Eighty Five percent of parents with Sunday School-age children would allow their children to attend Sunday School where it typically meets.
- Precautions that half or more parents would like to see are: prohibit snacks, kids use hand sanitizer, and that kids don't touch each other during activities.

As Pastor Mike has explained before, there are many factors involved in considering the return to indoor worship services. If we were to do that today, we would be required to wear masks, sit 6' apart, we couldn't have congregational singing, and we couldn't have air conditioning blowing on people (this is a partial list). So for now, we are pleased to have outdoor services in our church's beautiful back yard with shade trees. We are blessed to have a wonderful facility, parking lot, and yard for gathering as the Body of Christ. Please know that your Pastor, Church Staff and Administrative Council are working on your behalf to provide worship opportunities, activities, and a return to indoor worship when each of them is safe and practical. We will do our best to adhere to safety practices that allow us to function and keep us all safe, as well as possible. We ask that each of you would do what meets your comfort level for staying safe. Listening to 99.9 FM Sundays at 9:00 AM is one way to participate at a distance. Thanks again for providing your feedback through the survey!

Just a quick update on The Dinner Table. I think our new name should be the "Drive-Through Dinner Table." Since March of this year, we have had to pivot, rethink, retool, and reimagine how we can still serve the city of Windom through the Dinner Table.

We decided to serve in a drive-through capacity in the alley of the Presbyterian Church. This has worked beautifully for us, and we're so grateful for the use of the church. Before the COVID shutdown, we were serving between 75-130 guests the 4th Tuesday of every month in the fellowship hall of the Presbyterian Church. Since March, we have been serving 300+ meals each month outside. Just a few days ago, we served almost 400 meals! Thanks to McDonald's for donating 72 meals (yay!), and the Dinner Table purchasing sack lunches and \$5 gift cards from Hy-Vee, we were able to serve and bless 375+ guests in June. Wow! I told you God was good!

Thank you! Thank you! Thank you for your generous support to this mission. We were overwhelmed by your kindness and your prayers for us this past week. Please continue to pray for us as we move forward in Jesus Name by using our hands and feet to serve Him, by serving others.

Free Technology Is Available!


Being home alone right now is difficult. It can be especially difficult when you have a hearing loss, speech or physical disability that is preventing you from reaching out and staying connected to those you love. This can lead to feeling lonely and isolated.

If you or someone you know is having a hard time using the phone, the Telephone Equipment Distribution (TED) Program can help. This is a free service of the Minnesota Department of Human Services to those who qualify for the equipment. They can also help you to apply for phone and internet discounts. Create this colorful July 4th craft.

What you need:

- Decorated card stock square (5"x 5")
- Scissors
- Hole punch
- 2 one-inch circles of card stock
- Glue
- Pipe cleaner (3 inches)
- Drinking straw

What you do:

- Fold the square corner to corner to form an X. Unfold.
- 2. To make spokes, cut the four creases until an inch from the center.
- 3. Punch a hole in the middle of the square, near the tips of each spoke, and in the middle of each circle.
- 4. Fold each spoke toward the center, lining up the holes. Glue in place.
- 5. Wrap one end of the pipe cleaner around the top of the straw. Thread a circle, the pinwheel, and the remaining circle onto the pipe cleaner.
- 6. Roll the pipe cleaner end into a ball. Then spin!


