Looking to a Murky Fall Season with Clarity

The number one question members of our church keep asking me is, "When will we get back to worship inside?" I sometimes want to quote Yoda from Star Wars, "Hard to see, the future is."

Because *I don't know*. Our District Superintendent, Rev. Dr. Fred Vanderwerf doesn't know. Bishop Ough doesn't know (*as our Conference leaders follow closely the guidelines set by our governor*).

I know, I know – some other churches in town (*or nearby*) are meeting inside. (*Don't tell anyone, but some of them are even singing*!)

And now we have yet another a new "guideline": when indoors in a public place, you're required to wear a mask. And we're still not supposed to sing in church.

Thankfully, we've had beautiful Sundays for outside "Worship on the Lawn". The rain this past weekend pushed us inside, but it also pushed us to figure out Facebook Live—and thanks to the skills and perseverance of several volunteers, it worked!

There are some bugs, but that's to be expected our first time online. We will improve as we go, and we will start using Facebook Live while we're worshiping outdoors in the future—and when we go back inside in the fall. This will increase our reach to those who can't (*or won't*) attend a worship service in person, but are still interested in "participating in" our worship services.

As we look at a Fall ministry season without knowing what "the rules" will be, <u>we can still have clarity</u> <u>about some things</u>:

- We will continue to worship in some form/format. We will find a way to begin our Children's ministry and Youth ministry—if not in person in large groups, then online and in some small groups (*we're watching what the public schools will do for clues...*).
- When we are back inside, some things will be different. Our worship space will be reconfigured somewhat for a better online visual presence (*through the brutally honest lens of a camera*!). Worship services may continue to be shorter and simplified (*I know I won't hear any complaints about that!*).
- Our initial plans are to continue Sunday morning worship at 9:00 through September (*and possibly October*), while having a Vacation Bible School on Sunday mornings (*more info will be coming soon on this for parents!*).
- Other small group ministries, like Bible studies and Sunday adult classes, should be able to resume for those who are comfortable attending.
- Wednesday night programming for children and youth will also begin in early fall.

In other words, we <u>DO</u> have some clarity about our mission: we want to continue to be the body of Christ, <u>CONNECTED</u> to one another in meaningful ways for worship, learning, serving and outreach!

Finally, we also have clarity about the need for a new ministry team to serve with Robin to disciple our Jr. and Sr. High youth. Robin will recruit and train 6-8 adults to be part of this team, and also call on parents and other volunteers to be "hands on" from time to time as needed.

So this I know for sure—with clarity—there are exciting times ahead—because God is still in our midst and working! Keep praying to follow him with clarity! —*Pastor Mike*
