## Life After Confirmation

The Covid-19 virus has interrupted our lives in countless ways... including delaying Confirmation from last spring until this fall. But—finally—this Sunday, we will confirm eight of our youth as they continue their journey of life and faith.

It's important to remember that the moment (or day) of Confirmation, while significant, is only one step, one milestone on our journey. Yes, we all know that, but it's easy to think of "being confirmed" as having some sort of finality to it. So let's be careful here...

Think of other "milestone events" in your life; while they are significant, they don't mean anything unless and until you go on living. Being born doesn't matter unless you keep breathing and learning and progressing every day. A diploma from high school or college may open some doors, but you have to walk through them and work—prove yourself! Marriage is not a destination, it's the beginning of something that must be invested in daily.

And it's the same way with Confirmation. To those of you who are older—and were confirmed at some time back there in history—how has your faith grown since Confirmation? How have you invested spiritually in your relationship with God through Jesus Christ? What specific habits or activities today are still nurturing your growth in faith and life?

It's a journey of faith, not a destination—certainly not a destination we arrive at while still in our teens. And I'll be talking about that with our Confirmands on Sunday: so here's some brief thoughts from an "irrelevant over 60 pastor" to a group of young, shrewd, techie, connected youth who are a carbon copy of their generation in many ways...they are:

- Well off by world standards;
- Advantaged (again, by world standards);
- Experienced the reality and pain of family breakup (which may make them fearful of being able to have a lifelong relationship themselves; and why should they, when our culture also says that is passé, unnecessary and boring...);
- Disconnected from any historical mooring to a deeper cultural tradition where they might find an identity worth embracing;
- Mostly don't question our culture of materialism and acquisition.

What is *real* today? What is fake (fake news, fake eyelashes, fake hair, fake image...) Like most folks today, our youth are living in a mostly "online" world...but how real is that? Or is it more like the movie, *The Matrix*? And we're getting depressed over something that isn't real!

Our attitude and happiness has become driven by others' opinion of us. This is NOT healthy. And we've entered into a tech culture of soft tyranny: Big Tech knows way more about you than you realize, and they use it to manipulate you in ways you also don't realize!

I'm hoping to share an "alternative reality" with our Confirmands this Sunday; to challenge them to think for themselves, from a Christian worldview—something that is almost unknown today. But it can help them navigate life, experience God more fully, and discover a deeper, more meaningful purpose for their lives. Pray for them as they live life after confirmation!

## Sunday School Mission Project Operation Christmas Child

The Sunday School classes are gearing up for a mission project. Operation Christmas Child. This is a unique project of Samaritan's Purse that delivers gift-filled shoe boxes to hurting children around the world. This simple hands-on mission project gives our entire church family, especially children, a tangible way to demonstrate the true meaning of Christmas—God's gift of His Son.

There is a drop off box in the sign-up area of the church lobby if you would like to donate items

to be packed by Sunday school children. The age groups for giving are 2-4, 5-9, and 10-14. Items are needed for both boys and girls. Most things are accepted but the following items are not: Used or damaged items; war-related items; chocolate or food; out of date candy; fruit rolls or other fruit snacks; drink mixes (powdered or liquid); liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans. Please bring your items to church prior to

November 13th. There is also a cost of \$9.00/box to ship these gifts. If you would like to help with this cost, please make your check payable to the church with Operation Christmas Child transportation in the memo line. These boxes also need your prayers. We will pray over them in church before we send them off.

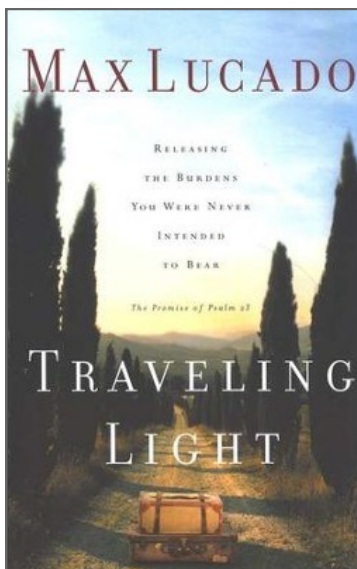

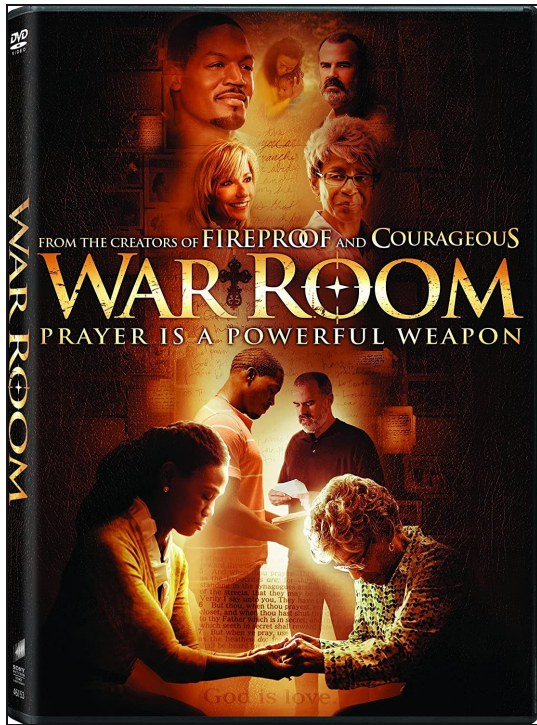
