

5 Simple Ways You Can Make This Lesson Stick With Your Kids

THIS WEEK'S LESSON: THE KINGS



IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

Today we talked about the kings of Israel. The people of Israel wanted a king, someone to look up to, but the kings were only human. Today's heroes are no less flawed, and human heroes will always let us down. The only hero we can always look up to is Jesus.



MANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

What heroes do your kids have? What makes them heroic? What makes them less than heroic? Discuss heroes with your kids and help them to understand why we should never put all our trust in human heroes.



AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- Why did the kings of Israel let their people down?
- Who are some heroes today actors, musicians, athletes who have let their fans down?
- What makes Jesus different from other heroes?



AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

"Your word is a lamp for my feet, a light on my path." - Psalm 119:105 (NIV)



PARENT TIME:
