

5 Simple Ways You Can Make This Lesson Stick With Your Kids

THIS WEEK'S LESSON: SORRY



IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

Today's lesson was about the game Sorry and learning the importance of saying we are sorry. When we've wronged someone, Jesus says we need to go and make things right with that person, apologizing and making amends.



HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Look for chances to coach your kids through times when they need to apologize. Help them to see why saying you're sorry is important, not just to acknowledge our faults but to strengthen our relationships.



AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- What does Jesus say about saying you're sorry?
- Do you think people say "sorry" because they are really sorry, or because they got
- What are some actions you can take to say you are sorry to someone?



AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:
