OUR SUMMER MISSION

Mustard Seed Network is a group of church planting churches in unreached, urban Japan. While Japan as a nation is less than 1% Christian, currently Mustard Seed Network is working towards planting 12 churches in the 12 largest cities of Japan by the year 2025. The missions offering from this summer at High Hill Christian Camp will go towards this 12 churches 12 cities campaign and especially towards gospel-centered church plant #6 in the city of Sendai next spring.

SENDAIJAPAN

Sendai, the de facto capital of the Tohoku region in northeast Japan, is now known worldwide for the massive earthquake and tsunami which struck the city in March 2011. The 9.0 magnitude earthquake and resulting 24-foot waves killed or injured three thousand in the city and reduced tens of thousands of buildings to rubble. In typical Japanese fashion, Sendai's economy has recovered to pre-disaster levels, yet the effects of the disaster still weigh heavy on people's hearts
