Coming to life as Jesus did through the virgin birth reminds us that God Himself has chosen no beginning point for His wonder-working apart from human beings. In Mary, He demonstrates His willingness to work through an imperfect human and earthen vessel, and He is still unashamed to do the same today.

Ordinary Mary....ordinary us. Tainted by the fall, as well as we. "Just as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world." *The promise was brought to her; to grow in her; to be delivered through her; to change the world around her.*

He's still looking for human vessels through whom He can implement His redemptive promises. There isn't anyone in history that was more surprised by God's calling than the Virgin Mary. Living Righteously: Choosing to Live Like Christ

While being away from home, I have noticed how easy it is for one to use their newfound freedom in ways that can be problematic. No, I am not saying that this was the case with me. That being said, the following thoughts have come across my mind: "You are only accountable to you and no one else. I am so many miles away from home, who is going to stop me from doing what I want?" These thoughts were admittedly enticing at first, especially since I have seen many friends carry this attitude once they left home. But then, this came to mind: "*Am I truly using my freedom to live like Christ*?" It was at this point where Ephesians 4:1 came to my attention:

"As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received?"

Living a life worthy of your calling. What exactly does that entail? According to Ephesians 4:17-32, this includes leaving your former life behind, being honest about who you speak of, watching what you say and how you say it, and removing anger and sensuality from your life. All of these things occur when we allow Christ to renew our minds (Ephesians 4:24; Romans 12:2). When our minds are aligned with Him, our behavior will align with Him as well. These are the keys to living righteously. Living in this manner demonstrates that Christ is in you, and His light will shine through. Proverbs 13:9 echoes this, saying that *"The light of the righteous shines brightly, but the lamp of the wicked is snuffed out."*

Now the question is, is living like Christ (living righteously) even a concern for you?

Although it seems that the obvious answer would be yes, this is not the case for most. Many are concerned with fulfilling their desires and prioritize other things. If something is not a concern, then no attention will be given to it. And even if some may say it is a concern, they may show otherwise by their actions.

If you are concerned with living righteously, consider these questions: How am I living right now, and where has it taken me? Do my thoughts and actions line up with Christ?



Although I am allowed to live as I please, I am deliberately choosing to live like Christ. This is a *choice*, meaning that this is something that you need to willingly do in order to live righteously. It may be more challenging to submit your ways to Him, but I assure you that it will also save your life if you do.

Submit yourselves, then, to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. James 4:7 (NIV)
