THIS WEEK'S LESSON: PRETZELS



IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

Today we talked about being the salt of the Earth. Salt tastes good on pretzels and other treats, and keeps us coming back for more. Being the salt of the Earth means we have a joy and enthusiasm for Christ that draws other people to Jesus. Matthew 5:13-16, Salt & Light

AT DINNER:

MPARENT TIME:

What you need to know:
