THIS WEEK'S LESSON: MISSION ASSIGNMENT



IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home: Saul was on a mission: to stop the Christians from telling people about Jesus. Then on the road to Damascus, Saul was blinded by a light and given a new mission: To go throughout the world and preach the name of Jesus. Acts 9:1-19, Saul's Conversion



MANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Does your work place have a mission statement? Share that with your kids, or share a current mission/project you have going at work or at home. Ask your kids if they know what God's mission is for the church and Christians.



AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- Who was Saul?
- Why did God command Saul to begin spreading the good news about Jesus?
- Why is it important that we accept God's mission?



AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse: "All things are possible with God." Mark 10:27b (NIrV)



🎆 PARENT TIME:
