THIS WEEK'S LESSON: POPCORN

IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home: Today we had popcorn and talked about how popcorn pops when we cook it. God has been good to us, and when we remember the good things he has done, we need to pop with praise. Luke 18:35-43, A Blind Beggar Receives His Sight

TANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real: Make Fiddle Faddle, or just plain popcorn, with the kids. Then re-read Luke 18:35-43.

AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- What did the blind man ask Jesus to do?
- What did the man do after Jesus healed him?
- What is one thing we can praise Jesus for?



AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse: "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." - Ephesians 2:10 (NIV)



ID PARENT TIME:
