IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

Today we had Rice Krispie treats shaped like fish. Why fish? Because Jesus has called us to fish for people and to share Jesus with others. Mark 1:14-20, Calling the First Disciples



R HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Make Rice Krispie Treats with the kids, and re-read Mark 1:14-20.



AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- What job did Peter, John, James, and Andrew have when Jesus met them?
- What does it mean to be fishers of people?
- How can we share Jesus with our friends?



AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

"For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." - Ephesians 2:10 (NIV)
