"Play the Game of Life with Gratitude"

In John Ortberg's book, <u>When the Game is Over It All Goes Back in the Box</u>, there is a chapter entitled "Play with Gratitude." The message of the chapter is simply "Live life with an attitude of gratitude and it will be more fulfilling than you could ever imagine." In that chapter, the foundational scripture is Luke 17:11-19, the story of Jesus healing ten lepers but only one returning to give thanks. The Lukan story shows us that ingratitude is a sin and a travesty. Gratitude is our ability to open up our hearts, eyes, and minds to recognize the goodness of God in all that God has blessed us with. Only through the lens of gratitude can we appreciate all that God has provided for us. Counting our blessings gives us the opportunity to be more thankful to God for things ranging from the simplest to the complex.

Sometimes we take the simple things for granted but we need to remember that God has been good to us in a number of ways that for the most part we have failed to appreciate. One of the ways we express gratitude to God is through praise and worship. Praise is a form of gratitude that is expressive and unmistakably intentional. Praise is something we do in the church and outside of the church, but especially in the church. If we were grateful to God for everything God has provided for us, then this church would be "jumpin" every Sunday morning.

I am grateful for Wesley United Methodist Church. I am grateful for the all of the challenges that we are confronted with because adversity doesn't build character it reveals character. You would not be who you are today if God had not allowed you to experience some good, some bad, and some ugly. Be grateful for what God is doing in your life. Morning Scripture Daniel 3:16-25 (NKJV)

¹⁶ Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-Nego answered and said to the king, "O Nebuchadnezzar, we have no need to answer you in this matter.

¹⁷ If that is the case, our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the burning fiery furnace, and He will deliver us from your hand, O king.

¹⁸ But if not, let it be known to you, O king, that we do not serve your gods, nor will we worship the gold image which you have set up."

¹⁹ Then Nebuchadnezzar was full of fury, and the expression on his face changed toward Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-Nego. He spoke and commanded that they heat the furnace seven times more than it was usually heated.

²⁰ And he commanded certain mighty men of valor who were in his army to bind Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-Nego, and cast them into the burning fiery furnace.

²¹ Then these men were bound in their coats, their trousers, their turbans, and their other garments, and were cast into the midst of the burning fiery furnace.

²² Therefore, because the king's command was urgent, and the furnace exceedingly hot, the flame of the fire killed those men who took up Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-Nego.

²³ And these three men, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-Nego, fell down bound into the midst of the burning fiery furnace.

²⁴ Then King Nebuchadnezzar was astonished; and he rose in haste and spoke, saying to his counselors, "Did we not cast three men bound into the midst of the fire?"

They answered and said to the king, "True, O king."

²⁵ "Look!" he answered, "I see four men loose, walking in the midst of the fire; and they are not hurt, and the form of the fourth is like the Son of God."

In Praise of the 'Essential Workers' Helping Us All to Brave the Storm of Coronavirus

Here's to the essential worker. To all the previously "invisible people" who some of us may suddenly now have discovered make the world go 'round. To those workers who sometimes have been reduced to being "just a CNA." To workers marginalized in the eyes of some who see your job as being "less than"— less glorious, less important, less essential. Here's to you. To all the "thanked-less" men and women who happen to be "just a blue-collar worker." "Just a hospital orderly." "Just a cook." "Just a bus driver." "Just a trash man." "Just a gas station attendant." This one's for the overlooked, over-taxed underpaid worker. For every nameless, faceless person who does all the little things that even the least grateful among us these days ought to now see aren't so little after all.

For each and every one of you without whom this global pandemic would be made unendurable, if not un-survivable. This one's for you. For those who wake up each morning and kiss your own family goodbye to brave the storm called COVID-19, faithfully going to your jobs — jobs upon which we completely depend, as life as we knew it has been unceremoniously interrupted by the greatest viral threat to humankind in more than 100 years. For truck drivers. For train conductors. For food preparers and deliverers.

For those who march each perilous day to the front lines. For doctors and medical staff. Nurses. Technicians. Police officers, firefighters, paramedics, security guards and those whose posts are no less essential; whose sacrifice and bravery are no less weighty; and who deserve our respect and gratitude. This one's for the cashiers and the baggers at grocery stores who, by showing up each day, place yourselves potentially in the winds of the coronavirus.

For those who stock grocery shelves. For store greeters who now direct gloved and masked shoppers to sanitized metal carts as we enter in silence and caution, determined to get quickly in and out. For those who sometimes do the dirty or grimy jobs that make others cringe. Like cleaning up your charges at a nursing home — braving feces, urine and blood — and gently lifting an elderly woman from her wheelchair to her bed, going about your job with care and compassion. I see you. Perhaps I always have.

Little Known Black History Fact

Lucien Alexis, Sr.

Lucien Alexis, Sr. earned the nickname of the "Negro Einstein" while as a student at Harvard University. Despite facing an extreme set of obstacles, Alexis managed not only to graduate from the prestigious university, but became a famed educator himself. Alexis was born July 8, 1887 in New Orleans, La. Not much has been recorded about Alexis' childhood but what is known is that he took work as a railway mail clerk at the age of 20. For seven years, Alexis toiled and saved up enough funds for four years at Harvard. The university did accept him, but asked if he would attend the Phillips Exeter Academy in New Hampshire before entering Harvard.

The academy became a place where Alexis thrived, and also where he developed a love for foreign languages and the sciences. However, the year at Exeter cost him one year of his Harvard savings. Determined to fulfill his college dream, Alexis graduated "cum laude" in 1917, a year earlier than expected thus staving off the need for outside funds. In the same year, Alexis entered Officer's Training School in Des Moines, Ia., and was commissioned 1st Lieutenant of the 367th Infantry in World War I. After the war, met and married Rita Holt. They had one son together, Lucien Jr., who also attended Harvard and is part of its lore as well for reasons other than academics.

Alexis returned to his hometown of New Orleans, working as a teacher and assistant principal of a pair of elementary schools. But it was his appointment as principal for McDonough High School in the city that made him a legendary figure. McDonough was the only public high school for Black people at the time, and it was nestled in a poor neighborhood. For 30 years, Alexis turned the school into one of the best in the city. He had so much respect that unsavory figures near the school wouldn't bother any of his students as they traveled through the neighborhood.

During his time as an educator, Alexis continued his life of science and published several scientific articles. Upon retirement, he opened the Straight Business School in the city and his wife ran the facility. Alexis was also a member of the Alpha Phi Alpha fraternity. Alexis passed in 1981, outliving his son who died in 1975.
