"The Mission of the Church is to Make Disciples"

"Nazareth! Can anything good come from there?" Nathanael asked. "Come and see," said Philip (John 1:46).

It was Dietrich Bonhoeffer who said that "salvation is free but discipleship is costly." Mr. Bonhoeffer was intrigued by what he called the "cost of discipleship". In fact, he was so intrigued by it that he penned a book with the same title. In the book, he argues that modern-day Christians prefer a sanitized version of Christianity that allows them to do anything they want without being asked to submit or sacrifice for the sake of the gospel. He argues that modern-day Christians want 'cheap grace.' To him, cheap grace is the preaching of forgiveness without requiring repentance, baptism without church discipline, communion without confession. Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, and grace without Jesus the Christ." To follow Jesus is a costly endeavor. And I don't mean cost as in money. I mean "costly" as in it will cost you something like your time and talents, your energy and focus. Jesus gave His life to give birth to the church. The least we could do is to continue His work of building it up.

Since we are disciples of Jesus and therefore followers of Jesus it behooves us to truly follow Him. Bible readers recognize that Jesus had a mission to save those who He considered 'lost' because their connection to God had been severed. In Luke chapter 15 we see His theology of the lost unfold. When He is criticized for sharing table fellowship with known sinners such as tax collectors and people who could or did not adhere to the Mosaic Law, he tells three parables in chapter 15. And all of the parables have the same message: Heaven rejoices and has a party when one sinner reconnects with God. Evangelism is a rewarding yet costly endeavor. One we must engage in if we are going to be a church that makes disciples out of unbelievers and unchurched people.

According to Sam Chan, author of <u>Evangelism in a Skeptical World</u>, "the essence of evangelism is the message that Jesus Christ is Lord. Evangelism is our human effort of proclaiming this message—which necessarily involves using our human communication, language, idioms, metaphors, stories, experiences, personality, emotions, context, culture, locatedness—and trusting and praying that God, in His sovereign will, will supernaturally use our human and natural means to effect his divine purposes."

Evangelism is a rewarding yet costly endeavor. It will inconvenience you. It will move you out of your comfort zone. It will cause you to do things you never thought you would do. It will cause you to express your faith. It will cause you to share your story of how God saved you. It will cause you to be transparent in order to share your testimony with coworkers, friends, and family. It will cause you to face rejection by those who don't have time to hear what you have to say. Nonetheless, it is what we are called to do. Have a great week.

Asthma and COVID-19

In the United States, the burden of asthma falls disproportionately on African Americans and Hispanics. People with moderate to severe asthma may be at higher risk of getting very sick from COVID-19. COVID-19 can affect your respiratory tract (nose, throat, lungs), cause an asthma attack, and possibly lead to pneumonia and acute respiratory disease.

Avoid your asthma triggers

Common asthma triggers are Tobacco Smoke, Dust Mites, Cockroach Allergen, Outdoor Air Pollution, and Mold.

As more cases of COVID-19 are discovered and our communities take action to combat the spread of disease, it is natural for some people to feel concerned or stressed. Strong emotions can trigger an asthma attack.

Clean and disinfect things you or your family touch frequently

If possible, have someone who doesn't have asthma do the cleaning and disinfecting. When they use cleaning and disinfecting products, have them:

- Make sure that people with asthma are not in the room.
- Minimize use of disinfectants that can cause an asthma attack.
- Open windows or doors and use a fan that blows air outdoors.
- Clean and disinfect surfaces like phones, remotes, tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, keyboards, toilets, faucets, and sinks daily.

If you have symptoms

Contact your health care provider to ask about your symptoms.

Never Forget Our Only Sin: To Be Born in Black Skin

Never forget: They flayed us. Mutilated us. Cut off our genitals. Set us ablaze. Posed for photographs brazenly, sometimes giddily, in front of burnt Black bodies then mailed them as picture postcards. Lynching was American sport. A weapon of mass subjugation. Bloodthirsty white lynch mobs terrorized Blacks, administered cruel and visceral hate with virtually no repercussions. The devil is in the details: They skinned us alive. Picked off our charred remains — fingers, toes, ears — taking them as souvenirs like pieces of bone sold, according to one account, for 10 to 25 cents.

Good "Christian" folk, lawyers, judges, sheriffs, business owners and fellow countrymen and women, they partook of, or reveled in, the sight of a noose being pulled tightly around a Black body, watching it jerk. They lynched children, whole families, little girls, pregnant women, their bodies dangling from trees or bridges. Some smoldered into the sunrise as the scent of charred flesh drifted over the morning dew. Or a swarm of vultures was found devouring a hanging black corpse. Our only sin: To be born in black skin.

It is pure American hate in a land of so-called "freedom" and "democracy." It was during Reconstruction that a century-long era of racial hierarchy, lynching, white supremacy, and bigotry was established — an era from which this nation has yet to recover," the report concludes. Indeed the rate of documented racial terror lynchings during that period was nearly three times greater than the rate of killing in the decades following Reconstruction, according to the report. An earlier report in 2015 detailed more than 4,400 racial terror lynchings from 1877 to 1950, a 74-year span. "Thousands more were assaulted, raped, or injured in racial terror attacks between 1865 and 1877," the latest report reads. Bryan Stevenson, director of the legal advocacy group based in Montgomery, Alabama, writes in the introduction that the report aims "to provide context and analysis of what happened during this tragic period of American history and to describe its implications for the issues we face today.

"We believe our nation has failed to adequately address or acknowledge our history of racial injustice and that we must commit to a new era of truth-telling followed by meaningful efforts to repair and remedy the continuing legacy of racial oppression." The report, which documents 34 mass lynchings across the country, also concluded that thousands of additional victims that were undocumented may be forever lost to history.

But America must never be allowed to forget — lynchings recorded and those not, whether back then or today. Never forget.

Little Known Black History Fact

Juneteenth

As many around the nation and the world celebrated the 155th anniversary of Juneteenth last Friday, also known as Emancipation Day, here's what you should know about the important date in history.

Juneteenth is a celebration of June 19, 1865. On that day, slaves in Galveston, Texas, were informed by Major General Gordon Granger that slavery had ended. This occurred over two years after Abraham Lincoln outlawed slavery with the Emancipation Proclamation.

The news, which effectively ended their enslavement, ignited a slew of celebrations.

While there aren't any official Juneteenth songs, as the celebrations grew so did the adopting of socalled "Freedom Songs" or spirituals that are largely connected to the civil rights movement. Standout songs like "Lift Every Voice and Sing," "Swing Low, Sweet Chariot," and "This Little Light of Mine" also figured prominently in Juneteenth gatherings over the decades.

The family gatherings and cookouts that mark most nationally recognized holidays are also a strong centerpiece of Juneteenth. Community centers and churches also host events where readings of the Proclamation will take place, along with historical enactments and the like.

At these same events, the Freedom Songs will also hold some prominence in reflecting on the trials of those who were liberated from slavery that day.

Today, 47 states, including the District of Columbia, officially observe Juneteenth.
