# "Recharge Your Battery"

Greetings, family, in the name of our Powerful God! In Isaiah 6:8 it says, "Then I heard the voice of the Lord, saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us? Then I said, "Here am I, send me!" We, the church, are always on the lookout for new "Isaiahs" who are willing to step-up, step-out, and step-in to some great ministry opportunity. We are always on the lookout for people to make that great transition from the pew to involvement in ministry. We are always on the lookout for a believer to use his or her gift to lift the church a little higher towards its goal of excellence. Yes, Isaiahs, come forth and infect the entire congregation with your willingness to be sent out for ministry. But, remember, ministry is a marathon and not a sprint. ## **Unitl Black Lives Matter, Let Us Pray**

For vengeance, retaliation or federal troops are not the answer. Pray for the solution, for resolve, for unwavering will. Pray that peace will be still and confiscate this chaos. Pray that light will swallow up this darkness that fills the hearts and minds of too many young Black men with the insatiable lust to kill and kill again.

Pray. For righteousness exalts a nation, not sin. Pray that God will transform the hearts of men. However grand the plan to mend this ailing soulless city, let it begin with prayer. With the faithful fervent prayers uttered by our ancestors whose spirits still yearn for peace, freedom and the posterity of Black people. Prayers that lifted us up from chattel slavery to build grand institutions, even churches with grand steeples. Prayers that preserved us from cruel slave masters' hands. Prayers that led us as we walked through the valley of the shadow of death across America's lynching land, across the desert sands of Jim Crow's hate-filled plan. The prayers that helped Martin, Malcolm, Medgar and John Lewis stand. Pray. Like we used to — before complacency set in. Before we began to mimic the oppressor's plan. Before the glint of materialism stole our spiritual affections like a grand ploy that left us wandering across this Promised Land.

Pray that we will be bold as we confront the enemy on every side. Pray that His hand will guide. That He will grant us strength and the strategy to combat this gun violence that burns like wildfire, even as we

tire of the shooting and the body count. As killings mount. Pray that mothers will have the courage to turn in murderous sons. That young men will have the wisdom to put down their guns. Until Black lives matter. Let us pray.

# **Little Known Black History Fact**

## Jo Anderson

In modern times, despite poor record-keeping and erased histories, it has been revealed that enslaved African-Americans contributed far more than free labor to this country.

A slave, **Jo Anderson**, is largely credited as the co-inventor of the McCormick mechanical reaper, which revolutionized American farming in the 19th Century.

Jo Anderson, who was born in 1808, was owned by the family of inventor Robert McCormick. McCormick invented a horse-drawn reaper, which is an instrument that gathers and collects crops, but never refined the device. He handed over the designs to his son, Cyrus, who made significant improvements, but Anderson was right there in lockstep with the younger McCormick.

During this month in 1831, McCormick and Anderson debuted their version of the reaper with both men showing of its capabilities to speed up the harvest collection. The device was patented in 1834, and was largely seen as an updated version of earlier versions of the reaper that were invented in Scotland and other locales.

In 1931, Cyrus McCormick II, the grandson of Cyrus McCormick, wrote in his book *The Century of The Reaper* that Anderson should have been noted as a co-inventor of the device.

This family account has been supported by descendants of the McCormicks many times over. Another account that Anderson and McCormick were just a year apart in age and were more like brothers than slaves. When McCormick freed Anderson before the Civil War, Anderson couldn't live freely so he worked for farming neighbors at a rate of \$60 per month which McCormick paid until his death.


