"Giving It All You've Got!"

"For all of them have contributed out of their abundance; but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had, all she had to live on." (Mark 12:44)

Greetings, family, in the name of Jesus the Christ! Excuses are tools of incompetence used to build monuments of nothingness and those who specialize in them, seldom accomplish anything at all. When was the last time you gave maximum effort while doing something? When was the last time you worked your tail off in order to accomplish something? When was the last time you worked yourself to exhaustion in order to reach your goals? Well, if it has been a long time since you gave maximum effort will provide you with plenty of opportunities to do so.

Our walk with God demands that we give our best in all that we do in order to make disciples of Jesus and to make the kingdom of God a reality in our midst. In our text for today, Jesus sits down opposite the treasury and watches people put their tithes and offerings into the treasury. He notices that many rich persons are putting in large sums of money. But then a poor widow came and put in two small copper coins which were worth a penny. Jesus told his disciples that the poor widow had put in more than everyone else who had put money into the treasury. The others, he explained, contributed out of their abundance, while the widow had put in everything she had. The disciples knew that the woman did not literally put in more than the rich folk put in but it was profound for Jesus to point out the actions of the widow. What was he getting at? What was he trying to say? What message was he attempting to convey to his disciples?

First, Jesus appreciated the attitude of the widow. Her gift was the smallest but her generosity was the largest. She was only satisfied with giving all that she had. Even though she had very little, she decided to give it all rather than not give anything at all, or to give just a portion. Her attitude was if I am going to give something, it will be all that I have. She had a choice. She could have said, "I don't have a lot of money. This is all I have. I am going to wait until I have more money." But instead she sacrificed all that she had for her faith community. Her attitude is needed by many today.

Secondly, Jesus honored her because she held nothing back. What the widow had she gave. There was no keeping back anything for herself or for someone else. She was committed to giving all that she had to the Temple and not holding anything back. True stewardship is giving the Lord all that you have, all that you are, and getting the job done no matter what. The problem for many of us is that we hold back from God. We don't give our all or our best. That is what needs to happen here at Wesley UMC—people putting forth maximum effort.

Therefore, let's give it all we've got to make Wesley a flagship church! The widow specialized in sacrificial giving. That is what we have to specialize in because that is what Jesus specialized in. He held nothing back not even his life. Our job is to give whatever is necessary to make this church live, whether it is money, time, ideas, the work of your hands, prayers, ingenuity, and creativity. What and how much should we give? The answer is, "Whatever it takes!"

Respiratory Healthcare

Respiratory healthcare is a discipline that specializes in the promotion of respiratory function, health, and wellness. African Americans suffer from many major respiratory illnesses such as lung cancer, asthma, sleep apnea, and pneumonia. Health disparities such as pollution, lack of healthcare access, and low socioeconomic status all play a role that creates an atmosphere in which African Americans are more susceptible to respiratory illnesses.

African American Respiratory Statistics

- African Americans are 3x more likely to die from asthma than other racial groups.
- Black men are 50% more likely to suffer from lung cancer.
- African Americans are also ½ as likely to receive a flu or pneumonia vaccination.
- African American children are 3x as likely to suffer from sleep apnea.

Be Proactive

- Avoid indoor and outdoor air pollution.
- Avoid exposure to people who have the flu or other viral infections.
- · Exercise regularly.
- Eat a healthy, balanced diet.
- · Maintain a healthy weight.
- · See your doctor for an annual physical.

Georgia Voters Will Decide Fate of Senate and a New South

On Jan. 5, Georgia voters will decide the runoff for their two U.S. Senate seats. Their votes will determine whether Republicans retain control of the Senate or whether Democrats gain a 50-50 tie, with Vice President Kamala Harris the tie-breaking vote. The race is a microcosm of America's struggle to find a way forward and of Georgia and the South's struggle to build a new South. The two Democratic challengers reflect the new age still waiting to be born. Rev. Raphael Warnock, senior pastor at Atlanta's Ebenezer Baptist Church, the congregation led by the late Rev. Martin Luther King Jr., is a distinguished heir to the King tradition. Thirty-three-year-old Jon Ossoff, educated at Georgetown and the London School of Economics, was born and raised in Atlanta, interned for the late Rep. John Lewis and served as a national security staffer to Rep. Hank Johnson. He has been CEO of Insight TWI, a London based documentary maker that focuses on detailing corruption in foreign countries.

Both Rev. Warnock and Ossoff have put forth a moderate platform for change. Both support immediate action to forestall an economic collapse as the pandemic spikes. With Republicans blocking action in the Senate, millions now face an end to unemployment insurance, an end to the eviction moratorium — with one-third of households behind on their rent or mortgages — and an end to the student debt moratorium, with millions of young people still struggling to find jobs. Without assistance, states and localities will be forced to cut services and lay off employees like teachers and firefighters. Both Warnock and Ossoff support strengthening the Affordable Care Act by adding a public option and reducing prescription drug prices but oppose Medicare for All. Both call for bold action to deal with the reality of catastrophic climate change but oppose the Green New Deal. Both are for lifting the minimum wage, and for assistance to small businesses.

Their Republican opponents are the sitting senators — Kelly Loeffler and David Perdue. Both Loeffler and Perdue are multimillionaires. Both were charged with insider trading, selling stocks after receiving private briefings on the threat posed by the pandemic. Both dubiously claimed that their advisers made the trades without their knowledge. Both tout themselves as Donald Trump supporters. Neither Loeffler nor Perdue have a clue or a care for working for poor people in Georgia. So how do they hope to get elected? Both have adopted the same strategy: echo Donald Trump's divisive race-based populism and

benefit from systematic suppression of the vote. They've booked nearly \$200 million in vicious attack ads against their opponents, painting them as a threat to all things American. Neither America nor Georgia can move forward until the growing majority that is desperate for change overcomes the systematic efforts to divide and suppress. This country cannot begin to address the threats it faces - the pandemic, the economic collapse, corrosive and extreme inequality, catastrophic climate change, racial inequity, growing insecurity and a declining middle class - until those standing in the way are defeated.

Little Known Black History Fact



Bishop Leontine Kelly

Leontine Turpeau Current Kelly was a bishop of the United Methodist Church, making history on this day in 1984. She became the first African-American woman, and just the second woman overall, to be ordained by a major Christian denomination.

Leontine Turpeau was born on March 5, 1920 in Washington. D.C. Her father, David Turpeau Sr., was a prominent Methodist minister and Ohio congressman for many years. Ms. Turpeau completed her undergraduate studies at Virginia Union 1960 and studied at various institutions before earning her master of divinity degree from the Union Theological Seminary in 1976.

Kelly's first marriage was to the late Gloster Current, a minister and former deputy executive director of the NAACP. The pair had three children together. In 1956, she married Rev. David Kelly. Kelly was a Certified Lay Speaker in the church in the late '60's and was later ordained a deacon and elder. Kelly's first calling was the classroom and her call to the ministry came after the death of her second husband.

According to reports, the school district wanted Kelly to enter the ministry in her late husband's stead, but she initially resisted as she didn't get the call from God to do so. In her words, God eventually did call her to ministry where she rose to become one of the more visible members of her denomination, becoming an icon for international women's rights and job equity for all. Kelly was later inducted into the National Women's Hall of Fame.
