Radical Living: Be Poor in Spirit
January 11-12, 2020

One day as he saw the crowds gathering, Jesus went up on the mountainside and sat down. His disciples gathered around him, and he began to teach them. "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." -Jesus, Matthew 5:1-3 (NLT)

## What is the kingdom of heaven?

"I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full." - John 10:10

## What is spiritually poor?

To some who were confident of their own righteousness and looked down on everyone else, Jesus told this parable. "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood by himself and prayed: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people—robbers, evildoers, adulterers—or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week and give a tenth of all I get.' But the tax collector stood at a distance. He would not even look up to heaven, but beat his breast and said, 'God, have mercy on me, a sinner. 'I tell you that this man, rather than the other, went home justified before God." - Jesus, Luke 18:10-14a (NIV)



"For all those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted." -Jesus, Luke 9:14b

"Truly I tell you, the tax collectors and the prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God ahead of you." -Jesus, Matthew 21:31 (NIV)
