# Why did God choose to use this thing called FAITH?

Without faith it is impossible to please God. Hebrews 11:6

#1 Because faith is something I can understand.

### #2 Because it is the easiest and hardest thing to have.

#### #3 Faith and trust are the things that build relationships.
