Waiting on the Lord is not easy. It's difficult because it goes against human nature. Our human nature is full of the weeds of pride, selfishness, anger, and **impatience**. (Galatians 5:19-21). These things and more keep us from waiting on the Lord, often resulting in devastation.

Let me share 3 key ways to wait on the Lord:

- 1) Prayer Don't start out trying to fix it, pray first! 2) Keep your eye on the rewards that will result in your waiting.
- 3) While you're waiting, create a climate of gratitude and thanks-

giving. 4) Don't watch th

4) Don't watch the clock. Watch the promises.

Yes, life can get difficult, however, by waiting on God through prayer, focusing on the rewards, having an attitude of gratitude, and not watching the clock, God will come and refresh you with new confidence, and strength to live with new grace to go on in Victory! Do you need a refreshing? Then wait on God with the right perspective to come and renew your strength.

3) When sickness takes their life. When we as the church body stood in faith, fought, and did everything we knew to do to see them healed. But God decides to bring them home because of their suffering or for another reason we are not aware of. But we are not ready to

let them go! Though there is a sweet consolation when you know they are heaven bound and that you will see them again.

However, I have resolved in the joys and sorrows of pastoring to keep my eyes on Jesus and to trust in Him always. He is the sovereign God! He is good, He is just, and He is love - to name a very few of His superior qualities.

And as you go through things in this life, may you also remember these things.

Jehovah Tsidkenu, The Lord My Righteousness ~Diane Tripp-Bufford

For the month of May, I rendered the Tuesday night exhortation on Jehovah Tsidkenu, The Lord My Righteousness. Jehovah Tsidkenu was first mentioned in the bible by the Prophet Jeremiah (Jer 23:5-6).

Tsidkenu (or Tsedek), being the Hebrew word for righteousness means stiff, straight, quality of being right and just. The word "righteousness," appears 302 times in the bible and the word "righteous" is recorded 238 times in 225 verses. I believe that God wanted us to really understand righteousness! And yet, what does that look like?

First, we must under-

stand that righteousness, i.e., being right and just, is not earned; it is obtained from God through faith in Jesus Christ, when we are born again (Romans 10:9,10). Man's righteousness is confidence in one's own ability to do good. It's things we do to try and ~Continued to page 3

make us right with God. It looks great outwardly and people notice it, but the heart is defiled.

God's righteousness is the character of God, It is who He is in thought, word, and deed. We cannot walk the path of God's righteousness unless we acknowledge, who and what God is.

He is Jehovah, the incommunicable name of God, denoting his eternity and self-existence. All our righteousness has it's being from Him, and by Him only. That means, in order to walk in righteousness, we as

believers are to operate in His communicable qualities: goodness, justice, knowledge, love, mercy, speech, truthfulness, and wisdom. All of these qualities of God are seen throughout the Bible, Jesus himself left us over 50 commandments to live by and practice in our Christian walk.

And the rewards of righteousness are enumerable! "He who follows righteousness and mercy finds life, righteousness, and honor," Prov 21:21. Our pursuit of righteousness and sanctification rewards us

with many earthly benefits and heavenly treasures waiting to be claimed: love, long life, joy, good health and prosperity. Matt 22:37-39, 25:21, 1 Pet 1:8, Matt 6:32-33, Prov 10:22.

We can live a righteous life, with God the Father, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit in our Christian walk—especially if we keep our eyes on God's righteousness and not our own. The Lord wants to reward us here on earth, for obeying His commandments, for serving and for making disciples of men. So, let God be Jehovah Tsidkenu for you today!

Spotlight: Prime Timers












