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Why We Do Three Days of Thanksgiving Coupled with Fasting

One of the first responses of a sinner receiving salvation is "gratitude", followed up with love. Gratitude, or thanksgiving as we call it, is beneficial. Thanksgiving is November 28th and it is vitally important for us as a church and individually to take special time out each year to give heartfelt acknowledgement to God for all of His blessings.

In Luke 17:11-19, Jesus

healed ten lepers and only one came back to say "Thank you"; Jesus's response was "Where are the other nine?" One can only imagine the excuses of the nine who didn't come back with gratitude. Sadly to say, many in the church today fail to give God thanks for all He has done, doing, and will continue to do for us.

I believe this is one major key to having more of God's goodness directed our way in this upcoming new year. In Psalms 67: 5-6, one of my favorite scriptures on Thanksgiving says "Let the people praise Thee, O God: Let all the people praise Thee. Then shall the earth yield her increase; And God, even our own God shall **bless us**". In addition to thanking God for his goodness this year, there is a special blessing connected to those who will take time out to thank God.

One of the saddest stories in the Bible is the children of Israel's failure to reach the promise land. One of the reasons was their failure to acknowledge and thank God "because Thou servedst not the Lord thy God with joyfulness and with gladness of heart ~continued to page 2

An Enlightened View on Singleness

What is God's heart on singleness? That it is a good state in which to be. The word good (kalon) means advisable, advantageous, expedient, profitable and wholesome. It is a gift from God. It is a good state for widows. And the state in which to remain, if separation occurs and reconciliation is impossible according to

(I Cor 7:1, 7, 8, 10-11).

Singleness is the state of any man or woman who is of marriageable age but is not married. In the US, a young man or woman can get married at the age of 18 without the consent of a parent. However, looking back at what Pastor and I were like at that age, I think that is much too young. According to the Population Reference Bureau (PRB), the average age for first marriage is 27.6 for women and 29.5 for men in the United States. And in Illinois, the average age for first marriage is 28.6 for women and 30 for men.

As you can see by these statistics, people are remaining single for longer periods of time. I believe there is an advantage as it allows for more time to develop as a person. Successful marriages are made up of two singles who are whole in themselves.

By whole, I mean that they have surrendered to the Lordship of Jesus; that they appreciated who God has made them to be and have resolved their past hurts. Also, that they have given themselves a chance to accomplish ~Continued to page 2

for the abundance of all things; therefore shalt thou serve thine enemies which the Lord shall send against thee in hunger, and in thirst and in nakedness, and in want of all things: and He shall put a yoke of iron upon thy neck, until he have destroyed thee." (Deut 28:47-48). What a tragic end for God's people who don't give Him thanks.

May this heartbreaking attitude of ungratefulness not be found in us. God commands us to be thankful in everything. And that means that thankfulness should not only occur when things are good but even when circumstances are not as we would wish. (I Thess 5:18, Rom 8:28)

In sincere expression of our thankfulness to God, one week before the actual Thanksgiving Day, on November 19 through November 21, we have given special thanks coupled with fasting. If you missed out on those dates, you can still take time out give thanks to

Him, coupled with fasting. Information about how to do a three-day fast, along with 100 thanks-giving scriptures, will be on the table at the back of the church.

Also, during the month of November, we ask that you give a special one-time **Thanksgiving offering**. This special offering will go towards the Children's, Nursery, and Women's Ministry.

May you be filled with gratitude to God for who He is and all His Goodness!

You don't even have to wait until Sunday to give your offering and can give at any time or any place.

You can setup your giving to be automatically synced with your pay cycle, so you won't have to worry about forgetting to make an offering. You don't even need to fill out an offering envelope any more.

Everything will take place online. Your information is safely encrypted in a database. You can even lookup the history of your giving online without having to call the church. Once you enter in your information initially, you only have to press a few buttons for your next gift. Pushpay makes giving easy and convenient for you. Now you can give whatever you want when you want.


Dear Mother Eunice, I am a single mother with two children and I have been dating a man who also has two children. What is one thing I need to think about should I marry this man?
