I can clearly recall times of stress. I spent close to four years in Greeley, Colorado working on my bachelor's degree in Speech and language therapy; only to realize in the very last quarter I did not have the money to finish. You can only imagine the stress and anxiety.

I raised three daughters; two of them fell in love and decided to get married Although it was a joyful occasion, it was taxing especially on their wedding days.

Losing my sister shortly after receiving the call to ministry was devastatingly stressful. Dealing with a painful skin disease for over a year was stressful. Having to wait ten years for a church building was extremely stressful.

Even now, living during this global pandemic and social/moral upheaval has brought on a season of great stress. Although stress is a normal part of life, it has the ability to negatively impact our lives.

Stress is defined as a physical, mental, or emotional strain or tension. Stress is the body's reaction to any change that requires an adjustment or response. The body reacts to these changes with physical, mental, and emotional responses. All a normal part of life but can be managed.

The Bible doesn't use the word stress; it uses the words *anxiety*, *worry*, and *trouble*—things we often associate with stress.

Although stress is a normal part of life, it can be toxic. Toxic stress is chronic stress that happens without supportive relationships. Prolonged toxic stress is generally bad for your health and wellbeing. The truth is, stress impacts us all differently.

Some can easily pull through stress and change, while others have more difficulty.

It is no secret that we

5. To remind us of our responsibility to share our faith in Jesus Christ with others. Church helps us learn how to share our faith.

Finally, the sixth reason, which I feel is the most important; to experience the presence of God in His house. King David said in Psalm 122:1, "I was glad when they said let us go into the house of the Lord". So, the question is, why would someone who practically had everything one could imagine, want to go to church. We can understand why when you examine closely the discourse of David and his advisor in 2 Samuel 6:13-14. In this passage David

Dear Mother Eunice, I know gossiping is a sin, but is it still considered gossiping to talk about someone if they've already put their business out on social media anyway?

It is true that some of the power of gossip is undercut when the nature of a thing has already been revealed. Merriam-Webster defines gossip as a person who habitually reveals personal or sensational facts about others; and a rumor or report of an intimate nature. The idea behind gossip is that you are discussing private information that has not been made public. If the information is already public, it's not quite gossip as defined. And yet, I still do not believe that talking about other people is conduct in which a believer of Jesus Christ ought to take part in-whether the information has been shared with the class or not The Bible really and truly sums up how we should respond. Ephesians 4:29 says "Let no corrupt word proceed out of your mouth, but what is good for necessary edification, that it may impart grace to the hearers." The book of Proverbs constantly cautions us to have discretion. "Discretion will preserve you; understanding will keep you." (Prov 2:11). People may be willing to embarrass themselves and others online, but that does not mean that you have been given the green light to join in on the conversation. As 1 Thessalonians 4:10-11 says, "aspire to lead a quiet life...mind your own business."
