

INTRODUCTION:

Today we are going to look at the final seven years of earth's history - a period of time commonly referred to as the Great Tribulation. As the prophet/statesman Daniel revealed this period of time is essential to complete God's purpose for Israel and the world.



I. God's Prophet: Daniel

Daniel 1-6 records Daniel's remarkable ministry as God's representative during these seventy years of Israel's exile in Babylon. The first six chapters, however, are prophetic.

II. God's Prophecy

20 Now while I was speaking, praying, and confessing my sin and the sin of my people Israel, and presenting my supplication before the Lord my God for the holy mountain of my God, 21 yes, while I was speaking in prayer, the man Gabriel, whom I had seen in the vision at the beginning, being caused to fly swiftly, reached me about the time of the evening offering. 22 And he informed me, and talked with me, and said, "O Daniel, I have now come forth to give you skill to understand. 23 At the beginning of your supplications the command went out, and I have come to tell you, for you are greatly beloved; therefore consider the matter, and understand the vision: 24

"Seventy weeks[a] are determined For your people and for your holy city,

To finish the transgression, To make an end of[b] sins, To make reconciliation for iniquity, To bring in everlasting righteousness, To seal up vision and prophecy, And to anoint the Most Holy.

2. The First 69 Weeks Or 483 Years



4. The Final 70th Week Or Seven Years

Even until the consummation, which is determined,
Is poured out on the desolate."

IV. An Outline of Daniel's 70th Week ("The Day of The Lord")

A. ACT 1: The Beginning of The Tribulation

Three Major Events Will Occur:

1. The Rise of Antichrist

a. He will come to power after Christians are removed from the earth

And now you know what is restraining, that he may be revealed in his own time. 7 For the mystery of lawlessness is already at work; only He[a] who now restrains will do so until He[b] is taken out of the way. 8 And then the lawless one will be revealed, whom the Lord will consume with the breath of His mouth and destroy with the brightness of His coming. 9 The coming of the lawless one is according to the working of Satan, with all power, signs, and lying wonders, 2 Thessalonians 2:6-9

b. He must likely will be a Gentile

Then I[a] stood on the sand of the sea. And I saw a beast rising up out of the sea, having seven heads and ten horns,[b] and on his horns ten crowns, and on his heads a blasphemous name.

Revelation 13:1

c. He will rule over a revived Roman Empire that will apparently be in the form of a ten-nation confederacy
