Responsive Prayer

FIRST READING: Acts 7:55-60

⁵⁵Filled with the Holy Spirit, [Stephen] gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. ⁵⁶"Look," he said, "I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God!" ⁵⁷But they covered their ears, and with a loud shout all rushed together against him. ⁵⁸Then they dragged him out of the city and began to stone him; and the witnesses laid their coats at the feet of a young man named Saul. ⁵⁹While they were stoning Stephen, he prayed, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." ⁶⁰Then he knelt down and cried out in a loud voice, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them." When he had said this, he died.

Then the second reading for this Sunday may be read, as follows. SECOND READING: 1 Peter 2:2-10


²Like newborn infants, long for the pure, spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow into salvation — ³if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good.⁴Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and ⁵like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.⁶For it stands in scripture: "See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious; and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame." ⁷To you then who believe, he is precious; but for those who do not believe, "The stone that the builders rejected has become the very head of the corner," ⁸and "A stone that makes them stumble, and a rock that makes them fall." They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do. ⁹But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. ¹⁰Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

Word of God, word of life. **Thanks be to God.**

Then the gospel reading may be read, as follows.

Gospel: John 14:1-14

The holy Gospel according to John. **Glory to you, O Lord.**



[Jesus said to the disciples:]¹"Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God, believe also in me. ²In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? ³And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also. ⁴And you know the way to the place where I am going." ⁵Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?" ⁶Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. ⁷If you know me, you will know my Father also. From now on you do know him and have seen him." ⁸Philip said to him, "Lord, show us the Father, and we will be satisfied." ⁹Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you all this time, Philip, and you still do not know me? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? ¹⁰Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own; but the Father who dwells in me does his works. ¹¹Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; but if you do not, then believe me because of the works themselves. ¹²Very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father. ¹³I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. ¹⁴If in my name you ask me for anything, I will do it."

The gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

Reflection



"A PLACE BEING PREPARED OF US"

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

The gospel scripture that we have today is one that many times I have used over the years for a funeral or memorial service. When I first started to use it, it was for people who had lived in many different places over their lifetime. Another reason I have always liked to use it, is because it answers the question most people ask, "Is this all there is"? Here we find the answer. Yes, there is, and Jesus has it all in control as he assures us that he is going ahead to prepare a place. At the right time there is a place we will be welcomed with open arms and a love beyond any that we have felt on this side of eternity.

Last week one of the things that I pointed out was in the gospel of John where Jesus talks about himself and who he is. There he was telling those how he is the gate for the sheep. The good shepherd that makes sure that his sheep were safe from predators and brings them out to good pasture. This week again he is talking a great deal about himself, as a matter of fact in these fourteen verses, ten times he uses the pronoun "I", six times he uses "I am", twelve times "me", four times "my' and once "myself". I guess you could say it is all about Jesus and who he is. He is reinforcing how not only is he the gate, but he is also the one who goes to prepare a place for us, how he and the Father are one and that there is more that you disciples will do when I am no longer here. So, Jesus is saying to them and us, all this that I am sharing with you, there is no need to let your hearts be troubled.

Of course, as Jesus goes on to talk about himself and his relationship with God, it almost seems like the disciples just are not listening to what he is saying to them. Thomas says, "We do not know where you are going." Philip asks for him to show him the Father so they can be satisfied. I can almost see Jesus taking the heel of his hand to his forehead and saying to them. "LISTEN TO WHAT I AM SAYING TO YOU! I AM THE WAY, THE TRUTH AND THE LIFE, IF YOU HAVE SEEN ME YOU HAVE SEEN THE FATHER! AND YOU KNOW ALL THOSE WORKS I HAVE DONE IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER; YOU WILL DO EVEN GREATER WORKS! YA GOT IT?"

Of course, I do not see Jesus yelling at the disciples. No, he just calmly explains to them again who he is, and that when he is no longer with them, they are the ones who will carry on and they will do greater works than he did. You are to be the chosen ones who will carry on the work of serving and sharing the word of God to the world.

The miracle is that they eventually got it and went on to believe and to do what they had been called to do. The wonder and miracle is that the call has continued for more than two thousand years and counting.

The answer to: "What are the greater things?" It is the fact that even though those early disciples and those who followed including you and me, we might not be doing the big miracles Jesus had done, but the truth of Jesus and the Father are one has continued to be told. People have come to believe and know the truth and it has made them free. Baptisms have taken place around the world in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. People have gathered at the table and heard the words spoken, this *is my* body, and this *is my* blood, eat and drink, and be forgiven, and do this in remembrance of me. Let me be your abiding place now and eternally. Why? Because I said so! How many times do I need to tell you! Listen to me, hear my words and believe.

The greater thing that those disciples have done, and you and I continue to do, is to go and tell who Jesus said he was in so many different ways: "I am the bread of life", "I am the living bread that came down from heaven", "I am the light of the world", "I am the gate for the sheep", "I am the good shepherd", "I am the resurrection and the life", "I am the vine, and you are the branches", "I am the way, and the truth, and the life". Yes, Jesus was clear in saying who he was, and why he came and that he may give new life to all who believe and follow in his way, and in his truth, and in his life. Yes, we may pray and ask in Jesus name even today, where are we to go and that we may be shown the Father, and be assured Jesus will answer and show you and me all that we will need to do to follow in the way and not be troubled.

Yes, many times I have used, and other pastors have used this gospel at a funeral or memorial to give those gathered assurance that the end of our earthly life is not the end. The truth is there is so much more to this lesson, because we not only learn Jesus has gone to prepare a place for us, he and the Father are one, and he has told us all we need to do is listen to him and believe. Amen.



Alleluia! Christ is Risen!




