#### Notes from the October Meeting

The Session had a good retreat on Sunday, October 13, for about 3 hours. We considered ideas about engaging more of the congregation as well as the local community, and how to work on getting to know people better in our church family.

The items that were approved are:

- Change of time for the December Session meeting on Dec 17 to 7:30 p.m.
- Transfer of Disaster Relief Restricted monies back to the Endowment (the originating fund for this from 2011)

# 2020 Vision Challenge
