- Approval of the 2020 budget and updated report on the Stewardship campaign: 74 pledges of \$258.951.67 for 2020.
- Approved the Housing Resolution concerning the pastor's housing allowance.
- Approved (on the first reading and vote) to allow for \$75,000 to be taken from the Endowment in 2020 as needed.
- Taking down of the Christmas decorations is scheduled for Sunday, January 5.
