In-Person Worship POSTPONED until August 2 Due to Rising Numbers of COVID Cases



The Session, with the recommendations from the *What's Next* Taskforce, have decided to postpone the in-person worship until Sunday, August 2. In light of the rising numbers of COVID cases, it was discussed that for the safety of all, we should **not** take the risk at this time. The worship services will be either recorded or Livestreamed, as we are able to, and the recorded service will be on the church website.

It was also decided to **not** permit outside groups to use the church building until after August 2, unless the number of COVID cases begins to decrease.

These issues will be reconsidered at the July Session meeting and we will let you know any decisions that are made. You are asked to continue to pray for the Session and for God's guidance in this difficult and uncertain time.





It is amazing all the changes that can happen in just a few days. A week ago, we were ready and preparing for a Re-Gathering worship on July 5. But then, as the COVID-19 cases started to rise rapidly, we needed to have a reconsideration of what was best for the Central Presbyterian Church family. I know that you are as disappointed and sad as I am. I know that many of you were looking forward to coming and seeing church friends that you have not seen in 4 months. I am sad too about not being able to be together. But in light of the reality, it was important to postpone this re-gathering time until a later date when the COVID numbers are decreasing and there is less chance of infection.

As a leader, I seek wisdom from God for guidance. I also consult with colleagues who have had inperson worship already, as well as seeking understanding about the science from the medical experts. It has been very hard to know exactly what we should do. But by having the *What's Next* Taskforce to help plan and prepare for our in-person worship opportunity, I sought their wisdom and understanding as well as from the Session. So, at this point, the decision has been made that we will **not** gather together on July 5, and we will make plans for our Re-Gathering service on Sunday, August 2. The hard reality is that I am not sure any of us know when we will be able to gather as the family of Central Presbyterian.

I wish that I had a crystal ball to give me, and the Session, clear guidance as to when we can gather for worship, when we can have Sunday school, when we can have our Wednesday night dinner and program, and all the other aspects of life together. Instead, we are continuing in the time of uncertainty and flexibility. But one thing I do know is that God remains faithful and God will guide us through this time together. I also know that even though we are scattered about and unable to get together as the church, we continue to be the church in the way we live, and in the way we conduct our business, and in the way we continue to serve in our community and world.

Our main concern is that no one comes down with COVID-19 as a result of our live worship service created by a mass exposure. That will be the primary factor for future planning. So, I ask for your continued prayers and understanding as we move forward in this time. Continue to pray for those who are medical servants, for those who are serving in essential businesses and for their families, and continue to pray for those who are seeking vaccines and accurate tests for this virus, so that we, as a community, are able to come back together.

I keep you in my prayers, and I look forward to the day when we can gather again in Jesus' name to celebrate and rejoice in the love and grace of God in our lives and in our world.


