On Sunday, August 6, you will receive an email about a gift for you and your family which will be your access to these videos for all ages (there will be more information about this opportunity over the next weeks.)

As the session and committees continue to meet, we will stay on top of CDC and state recommendations because the health and safety of our congregation is at the forefront of our minds. Until the time when we see it as possible to meet in person for worship, we will continue with online services and virtual ministry. At Central, we are a family that can make it through anything together because the God of hope guides us through times of uncertainty. Don't hesitate to reach out if you need anything. I'm continually praying for you, and ask for your prayers for me and the Session leadership. I'll see you online.

- * Sandy Wilson was elected Clerk Pro-Tem of the Session.
- * The Nursery staff will continue to be paid at the summer Sunday rate.
- * The church building will remain closed to outside groups until Central regathers for worship and/or meetings.
- * Apple Academy has done well this summer, and is looking forward to having 45 children enrolled this fall. (There are a few more spaces available; please call the Apple office for more information.)
- * Property Committee is continuing to work on projects around the church.
- * Finance, Budget and Stewardship Committees thanked everyone for their continued giving to the work and ministry of the church.
- * Worship Committee and What's Next Committee recommended that there be **NO** in-person worship at this time, and for the foreseeable future due to the increase in virus cases in our area.



This year's Montreat Middle School Conference was held online, but our group went to "real" Montreat to experience and participate in it. We enjoyed living together at Trevor's Retreat House, hiking up Lookout Mountain, swimming in the pool, boating on Lake Susan, a little shopping in Black Mountain and at the stores in Montreat, spending time with affirmations for one another, and ending our week with a Candlelight service at the lake. We also ate well--Pasta bar, Pizza from *My Father's Pizza* in Black Mountain, Chicken and Mac and Cheese, sandwiches, ice cream, and French toast sticks (breakfast) with bacon and fruit!

This year's theme was *Endlessly Enough*, and we explored how God's love is Endlessly Enough, how we are created by God and are Endlessly Enough, and how our neighbors are Endlessly Enough. For this age group, that is a message they need to hear because they constantly hear how they need to work harder and do better and go faster and achieve more, even though they are in grades 5-8. 


