# **Reflections From a Rocking Chair**

"O give thanks to the LORD, for he is good; for his steadfast love endures forever." 1 Chronicles 16:34

We are in a season of thanksgiving. But it is hard to be thankful when our world, our lives, our nation, our families, and even our spirits are over stressed and anxious. This is a Thanksgiving like no other, and yet it might in fact be a more genuine Thanksgiving for we will have to limit our gatherings and limit our travels. But, we do not have to limit our thankfulness. So how are we to be thankful in the midst of a pandemic, and social upheavals, and natural disasters? What can we be thankful for in this time?

You might write your list down so that you can look at it throughout the next few weeks to remind yourself of your many blessings. Our lists can be a wonderful way to see the many blessings we have even in a difficult, but interesting time.

Scott Wise, Hugh Wise's son, has tested positive for the Corona virus.



### **Miniature Nativities - The Story**

These miniature nativities are a blending of two traditions in France. Following the French Revolution when religious displays were outlawed, the faithful French simply shrunk their nativities to a size that could easily be hidden. The second tradition is to hide a small prize into a king cake at Epiphany, and often these trinkets were the tiny nativity figures used. Many families in France have pieced together their cherished miniature nativities over the years, by acquiring the figures in their slice of cake.



Four styles of miniature nativities are available and are displayed in the hallway outside the office along with order forms. These Nativity pieces are hand painted and are food safe. Please turn your order form into the office with your payment, and your order will be filled.


