Jesus was asked, "What is the greatest Commandment?" It was a way that the religious leaders were hoping to trap him. Instead, Jesus answered by summing up the law into two statements: Love the Lord your God with all your heart, mind, soul and strength; and Love your neighbor as yourself. You can't get much more straightforward than that. Jesus said that this summed up all the laws, and it was simplified into one word: LOVE.

Friends, we are all feeling the stress of the rapid rising numbers of the virus and of those who are dying from complications caused by the virus. We all know friends and family who have tested positive. We have been warned about gathering in groups outside of our own household. We have been told that wearing a face mask works (doctors and nurses wear masks when dealing with the sick and in operating rooms.) We have been instructed to keep a 6-foot distance from one another. We have been shown how to properly wash our hands (20 seconds with soap and water) and reminded to wipe down surfaces. We have been told to stay home if we feel bad, and it is now probably best to remain home as much as possible. Yet the reality is that the numbers keep going up. As a Christian family, I am asking you to respond to this virus.

Ask yourselves: how are we going to protect one another, and ourselves, by taking the proper precautions and doing what is advised? Out of Love for your neighbor and your church family, please wear a mask. An effective mask is one that:

*When you wear it, cannot blow out a lighted candle,
*Must have a minimum of 2 layers of cloth,
*Should have a filter or other liner sew in or can be put in,
*And after each day of wearing your mask, it must be washed or replaced with a new one.

Out of Love for your brothers and sisters in this community, please be diligent in your hygiene, and in the way you live and work in the community.

Friends, be mindful of how close you stand to one another. Be aware of others around you, and if you need to distance, feel free to move away rather than telling another to back off. **Out of Love** for one another and in showing the love of Christ in this world, please stay home and isolate if you are not feeling well, if you have tested for the virus and are awaiting a result, or if you have tested positive.

LOVE is a demonstrative word. It is seen in how we live and care for one another. So may all that we do be done in Love.
