Dear church family,

When I read the scriptures leading up to the birth of Christ, I am always struck by how similar that very first Christmas is to Christmas today: a lot of people are tired from travelling; families are gathering together; people are packed in together; there are gifts; and it is a time of worship. All in all, it is a powerful time, which is precisely why our joy for our Savior – and grief for those who are going through this season without a loved one – abounds. It is so easy to miss the wonder amidst the business, which is why we are slowing down this year as we read from Luke's Gospel to listen to what God is doing.

As we prepare our hearts for the "coming" or "Advent" of Jesus, it can be hard to be still, so consider picking a time to intentionally relax, be refreshed and soak in worship and fellowship on one of these occasions:

- Dec. 1 Church to order white poinsettias.
  (To be placed in sanctuary Dec. 14)
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Week of Dec: Supper Club! This is the deadline to sign up for a warm time of fellowship over yummy food. Groups of 6-8 friends will meet for a meal (either at someone's house or at a restaurant, depending on the group's preference). - Dec 12, 7pm, Friday Piedmont Choral Society concert, with our own dear friend Kay Yates, returns with another wonderful service (See details in David's music column).
- Dec. 14 Time to drop off your Angel Tree gifts at church so they can be delivered!

- Dec. 14, 6pm: Annual Youth & Children's Play in Fellowship Hall (see David's nearby column).
- Dec. 21, 11am worship: Lessons & Carols.
- Dec. 24, 5:30pm. On Christmas Eve we will have our annual Children's Impromptu Pageant. By way of reminder, this pageant is very simple: right down the hall outside the sanctuary is the parlor. It is a time of teaching our children the faith, and it is a fun visual presentation of the Christmas story. After it's over, the costumes will be returned to the parlor, and then the children will return to the pews (or nursery, if you wish). No rehearsals necessary!


