Words of Encouragement....

> (Ephesians 1:3) "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing "

With all of the disruption and uncertainty of the past couple of months, it would do us well to remind ourselves of some certainties that God tells us we can count on. The Holy Spirit reminds us in Ephesians chapter 1 that our relationship with Jesus Christ provides us with every other possible spiritual blessing. That is an amazing thing to think about. It's even more amazing to understand and operate in!

In the fields of design and engineering, "redundancy" is the act of building in safeguards to compensate for possible failure of the primary system. The backup systems that are designed as a redundancy may never be used. In fact, engineers hope they are never actually used. But if they are needed, they are there in place, just in case...just waiting.

Think about the redundancy our Heavenly Father has built into the Christian life. He saves us, writes our name down in Heaven's book, we are adopted, and born again. He promises that He will never leave us, that nothing can ever snatch us from His hand, and that the life we now possess is everlasting. He indwells us, overshadows us, goes before us, comes behind us, and undergirds us. He has provided the Holy Spirit, the Scriptures, and the church (brothers and sisters to accompany us on our journey). He tells us we are saved, are His children, have become "sons of God," and that we shall "dwell in the House of the Lord forever."

The Father fully plans for us to arrive at His home safely, doesn't He? I'm not suggesting that any aspect of God's plan could possibly fail, such that He would need a back-up plan

"just in case" -- to design redundancy. But, how loving and considerate He is to provide so much for us, so that we might have peace of mind about our relationship with Him here on earth and our eternal well-being.

Even though the Apostle Paul did not use the word "redundancy" in Eph 1, he went to great lengths to convey to us who we are in Christ, using various expressions for what the Lord has done for all who are the redeemed. Here are some of those blessings that are "immeasurably more than all we could possibly ask or imagine":

<u>He chose us</u>. (Eph 1:4) Jesus said, "You did not choose me, but I chose you...." (Jn 15:16). He predestined us. (Eph 1:5) He has been making plans for us from the beginning. That's how special we are to Him.
