Words of Encouragement....

Phil 3:13-14 – Brothers and sisters, I have not achieved it, but I focus on this one thing: Forgetting the past and looking forward to what lies ahead, I press on to reach the end of the race and receive the heavenly prize for which God, through Christ Jesus, is calling us. [NLT]

Dear brothers and sisters, regardless of what has happened so far this year publicly, privately, politically, professionally, or personally – there are four things we can say with great certainty: *Jesus Christ is risen, Jesus Christ is Lord, Jesus Christ will restore all things, and Jesus Christ has called each of us to this very moment in time.*

These are four things every Christian should know and remember. Otherwise, we will be unable to make any real sense of our current cultural moment, or anything else that happens in our personal lives.

These four truths—again, that *Christ is risen, Christ is Lord, Christ will restore all things, and that we are called to this time and place*—are True, with a capital "T." They aren't true for me and not for you. They aren't true only for those who believe them to be true. They aren't true for our church and community and not for other churches and communities. They are just **True**. They describe God's involvement in and control over the world in which we live.

Even in our current American context—with all of its political divisions, cultural upheavals, and medical uncertainties – they are still true. In fact, it is in <u>this</u> climate, not another, that we Christians are called to advance that which is true, good, and righteous. It is in <u>this</u> climate, not another, that we must pursue what Jesus identified as the two great commandments: to love God with all our heart, mind, soul, and strength; and to love our neighbor as ourselves (i.e., to represent Christ clearly and openly to those around us).

These are strange and unusual times. This is not the first time in history circumstances have been so. Remember, He is risen... and He is in you. He is Lord... and we are His servants. He has called us... for such a time as this! He has not given us a spirit of fear (2 Tim 1:7)... but He has empowered us to love and encourage each other. He has also given us His Spirit and His Word to encourage us. Spend time with Him each day.

Please remember that we are back to our regularly scheduled services and activities here at the church facilities – and our Wednesday evening meals have now resumed at 5:30 PM. Invite your neighbors and friends to join you at church. They may be feeling alone and isolated, and may appreciate the encouragement of the fellowship and the Word of God.

As schools have started back and our society is trying to return to some sense normalcy, let us look to Christ, trust His Word, and remember these vitally important truths. Hold them fast and hold them up: Christ is risen. Christ is Lord. Christ will restore all things. And He has called us to this time and this place. Amen.


