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John 1:33 (NASB95) 33 "I did not recognize Him, but He who sent me to baptize in water said to me, 'He upon whom you see the Spirit descending and remaining upon Him, this is the One who baptizes in the Holy Acts 1:4-5 (NASB95) 4 Gathering them together, He commanded them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait for what the Father had promised, "Which," He said, "you heard of from Me; 5 for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."

These passages teach us that there is an experience called the baptism of the Holy Spirit?

Is the baptism of the Holy Spirit the same as regeneration which is the act of God whereby He renews the spiritual condition of a sinner. It is a spiritual change brought about by the work of the Holy Spirit so that the person then possesses new life-- eternal life.

Romans 10:9-10 (NASB95) 9 that if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved; 10 for with the heart a person believes, resulting in righteousness, and with the mouth he confesses, resulting in salvation.

The condition of salvation is based on confessing that Jesus Christ is Lord and believing in your heart that God raised Him from the dead and you would be saved.

 The real question is how was Christ raised?

Romans 8:11 (NASB95) 11 But if the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, He who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through His Spirit who dwells in you.

> It is one thing to be born of the Spirit yet another to be baptized with the Holy Spirit.

John 20:22 (NASB95) 22 And when He had said this, He breathed on them and *said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit.

Not clear but many believe that this reception of the Holy Spirit was in anticipation of the day of Pentecost: limited understanding, knowledge and empowerment.

Acts 1:4-5 (NASB95) 4 Gathering them together, He commanded them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait for what the Father had promised, "Which," He said, "you heard of from Me; 5 for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."

Matthew 28:19 (NASB95)
19 "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit,

Acts 1:8 (NASB95) 8 but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be My witnesses both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and even to the remotest part of the earth."
