
Isaiah 53:4-5 (NASB95)

Isaiah 53:4-5 (NASB95)

5 But He was pierced through for our
transgressions, He was crushed for our
iniquities; The chastening for our well-being *fell*
upon Him, And by His scourging we are
healed.



“Strong’s, 2390” iaomai [ee-ah-om-
ahee] meaning “I heal, generally of the
physical, sometimes of spiritual
disease.” *healing*, particularly as
supernatural and *bringing attention to*
the Lord Himself as the Great Physician



Mark 16:15-18 (NASB95)

15 And He said to them, “Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation. 16 “He who has believed and has been baptized shall be saved; but he who has disbelieved shall be condemned.

Mark 16:15-18 (NASB95)

17 “These signs will accompany those who have believed: in My name they will cast out demons, they will speak with new tongues; 18 they will pick up serpents, and if they drink any deadly *poison*, it will not hurt them;

they will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover.”



James 5:14-15 (NASB95)

14 Is anyone among you sick? *Then* he must call for the elders of the church and they are to pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord;

James 5:14-15 (NASB95)

15 and the prayer offered in faith will restore the one who is sick, and the Lord will raise him up, and if he has committed sins, they will be forgiven him. *[sickness: weakness, frailty, want of strength, weakness, illness, suffering, calamity, frailty.]*



1 Corinthians 12:8-10 (NASB95)

8 For to one is given the word of wisdom through the Spirit, and to another the word of knowledge according to the same Spirit; 9 to another faith by the same Spirit, and to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit,



1 Corinthians 12:8-10 (NASB95)

10 and to another the effecting of miracles,
and to another prophecy, and to another the
distinguishing of spirits, to another *various*
kinds of tongues, and to another the
interpretation of tongues.



1 Corinthians 14:27-28 (NASB95)

27 If anyone speaks in a tongue, *it should be* by two or at the most three, and *each* in turn, and one must interpret; 28 but if there is no interpreter, he must keep silent in the church; and let him speak to himself and to God.

The Greek definition of the word tongue means: language.

In Jerusalem there were 17 known languages, today there are 7,106.

When a person speaks in tongues it is a message from God.

That message is to be interpreted.

The message is to edify the church.

How do we know if the person speaking is speaking a real language?

- First of all I don't know all of the 7,106 languages.

How do we know if the person who interprets, interprets correctly?

- Second the interpretation should not be taken lightly because they are actually saying, "Thus sayeth the Lord."
- Third it must edify the church.

1 Corinthians 14:1 (NASB95)

Prophecy a Superior Gift

1 Pursue love, yet desire earnestly spiritual *gifts*, but especially that you may prophecy.


1 Corinthians 14:39 (NASB95)


