Point # 1

- *Where Jesus is concerned, nothing happens by coincidence, He always has a purpose and a plan.*
- *You have to be willing to go to the well.*

John 4:4-6 (NIV)

⁴ Now he had to go through Samaria. ⁵ So he came to a town in Samaria called Sychar, near the plot of ground Jacob had given to his son Joseph. ⁶ Jacob's well was there, and Jesus, tired as he was from the journey, sat down by the well. It was about the sixth hour.

John 4:7-9 (NIV)

⁷ When a Samaritan woman came to draw water, Jesus said to her, "Will you give me a drink?" ⁸ (His disciples had gone into the town to buy food.)

John 4:7-9 (NIV)

⁹ The Samaritan woman said to him, "You are a Jew and I am a Samaritan woman. How can you ask me for a drink?" (*For Jews do not associate with Samaritans.*)

This woman has a very questionable past, and she more than likely has an attitude.

John 4:10-12 (NIV)

¹⁰ Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water."

John 4:10-12 (NIV)

¹¹ "Sir," the woman said, "you have nothing to draw with and the well is deep. Where can you get this living water?" ¹² Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well and drank from it himself, as did also his sons and his flocks and herds?"

Point #2

When approached with the spiritual things of life, people have a tendency to change the subject, or get angry.

Sometimes it takes us to go to the well to hear the truth and then make a choice to embrace the truth or not.

Proverbs 21:9 (NIV)

⁹ Better to live on a corner of the roof than share a house with a quarrelsome wife.

Proverbs 21:19 (NIV)

¹⁹ *Better to live in a desert than with a quarrelsome and ill-tempered wife.*

Point #3

No matter your situation you are not so far gone that the Lord can't bring you back!

- *Married 5 times living with #6*
- *Her morals were questionable.*
- *I'm sure she didn't like where she was.*

John 4:13-14 (NIV)

¹³ Jesus answered, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again,
¹⁴ but whoever drinks the water I give him will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

Point #4

God will meet you where and when you are at your greatest point of need.

- *Even at the well when you least expect it.*
- *He will always meet you with the Word of God. [John 4:13]*

John 4:15-18 (NIV)

¹⁵ The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water so that I won't get thirsty and have to keep coming here to draw water."

¹⁶ He told her, "Go, call your husband and come back."

John 4:15-18 (NIV)

¹⁷ "I have no husband," she replied. Jesus said to her, "You are right when you say you have no husband. ¹⁸ The fact is, you have had five husbands, and the man you now have is not your husband. What you have just said is quite true."

Point #5

Jesus will make you face your current condition and your need for Him!

- I am sure this women's brain is spinning, how does He know so much about me.
- He knows, He wants you to know!

John 4:19-22 (NIV)

¹⁹ "Sir," the woman said, "I can see that you are a prophet. ²⁰ Our fathers worshiped on this mountain, but you Jews claim that the place where we must worship is in Jerusalem."

John 4:19-22 (NIV)

²¹ Jesus declared, "Believe me, woman, a time is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. ²² You Samaritans worship what you do not know; we worship what we do know, for salvation is from the Jews.



Point #6

Stop making excuses, God brought you to the well for a reason, to discover Him for the first time, or discover what you have been missing in your life: a closeness with Him.


John 4:23-24 (NIV)

²³ Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks.

²⁴ God is spirit, and his worshipers must worship in spirit and in truth."

John 8:31-32 (NIV)

³¹ To the Jews who had believed him, Jesus said, "If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples. ³² Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

Point #7

John 4:42 (NIV)

⁴² They said to the woman, "We no longer believe just because of what you said; now we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this man really is the Savior of the world."
