



If you would like to volunteer to help deliver in April, please call Shirley Lyons, our April coordinator. Our volunteers spend less than an hour a day Monday—Friday to deliver meals, and typically deliver for one week. This is a great opportunity to serve others!



Did you know......that the Windom meal site not only delivers meals, deliver a difference but also serves meals at the Windom Community Center, and offers take-out meals?

"Windom Senior Dining" is run by Lutheran Social Services, and performs a very important service in the Windom area. Windom Senior Dining's numbers have been declining in recent years, and they are encouraging people to come for a good meal at a very reasonable price. Meals are discounted for anyone over 60 (\$4.50), and adults of any age can take part in their meals (\$7.25 under age 60). The food is delicious, served Monday—Friday (except holidays) promptly at 11:30am. Call to reserve a meal at 831-6161, or if you have any questions. Menus are available at our church.

Taking Action Against Hunger in Minnesota

- Over 3,000,000 visits are made to Minnesota food shelves each year.
- 1 in 8 children in Minnesota struggle with hunger.
- More than 500,000 Minnesotans experience food insecurity.
- Local food shelves can often stretch your \$1 into enough food for 2 or more meals.
- The 2018 March Campaign raised more than 5.5 million pounds of food and \$8.1 million for Minnesota food shelves.
- 100% of financial contributions to Minnesota FoodShare via the March Campaign go to participating food shelves.


Administrative Council Notes



Minnesota Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church

CONFERENCE CONNECTIONS

All United Methodist churches are connected through shared mission and ministry and united in their efforts to grow in love of God and neighbor, reach new people, and heal a broken world. Check out these news tidbits from the Minnesota Annual Conference, which serves all 350 United Methodist churches in the state.

- Make it a fun summer with Camp Minnesota: Summer is right around the corner, and that means it's time to register for camp! In addition to enjoying all the traditional camp activities, youth campers learn about Christ, experience creation, and are part of a nurturing community. Visit www.campminnesota.org to learn more and register! The early bird deadline is April 30.
- Pray for the Special Session of General Conference: This month (Feb. 23-26), a special session of General Conference (the top policy-making body of The United Methodist Church) will meet to discern a way forward for the denomination around the issue of human sexuality. Bishop Bruce R. Ough and the eight other bishops in the North Central Jurisdiction urge you to pray for this gathering and those who will be present. In a pastoral letter, the bishops shared this reminder: "Know that whatever decisions the General Conference makes, the ministry to which we are called in our churches, making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world, will continue. The day after General Conference there will still be hungry people needing food, those mired in poverty needing help, addicted people needing freedom, frayed relationships needing mending, broken lives needing healing, lost lives needing saving, injustices needing to be righted, and this work of God in Jesus Christ will still call to each of us and to our churches."

BRIGHT SPOTS IN OUR MIDST

- Online worship helps churches, conference reach new people: Live streaming has become a key tool for churches to reach new people, share Christ, and provide support to those who aren't part of a church community. In 2017, the first year online worship attendance was tracked, 39 Minnesota United Methodist churches collectively reported that 1,579 people on average tuned in remotely on a weekly basis. In-person and online numbers together show a slight worship attendance increase for the Minnesota Conference as compared to the prior year when online worship wasn't recorded. Figures for 2018 aren't finalized, but this preliminary data suggests that meeting people where they are could have the potential to halt and perhaps even reverse a decades-long trend of worship attendance decline. "Somebody who streams regularly but never shows up physically isn't necessarily a help to your church institutionally," said Rev. Paul Baudhuin, who serves Aldersgate UMC in St. Louis Park. "But in terms of authentic reaching people with the good news—I think streaming has immense opportunities."
- Beardsley UMC reaches elderly through nursing home ministry: Members of Beardsley UMC travel to two area nursing homes a monthly basis. Lay people in the congregation lead residents in singing hymns and give a message tied to a Biblical theme or passage. They conclude by inviting everyone present to hold hands and recite the Lord's Prayer, then enjoy fellowship and refreshments. Nearly every member of Beardsley UMC—which averages 20 to 25 in worship—has participated in the ministry. "To me, this is a powerful demonstration of cultivating and nurturing disciples not only in our own congregation, but a demonstration of Christ-like behavior to individuals who might not have a church family," said Rev. Ailsa Harl.
