# Is there a difference between being a "good person" and being a "Christian"?

Many people would probably say, "No—what's the difference?" And even if you think there <u>is</u> a difference, can you say what that difference would be? How is being a Christian different than—something other than—being a good or moral person? How would you say they're different?

Paul's New Testament letter to the churches of Galatia was actually written to address this question—*and this misunderstanding of Christian faith*.



So what's the problem? The problem was that people were beginning to substitute "good moral behavior" for personal faith in Jesus Christ. Specifically in Paul's day, many of these folks were falling back on the Jewish Law to try to be "good moral people" or "righteous" before God and therefore worthy of salvation. They were in danger of living by good works rather than faith in Christ's gift of new life.

In our church (and churches) today, we can fall into this same trap. Even though we're not first generation believers, it's very easy for us to fall into "works righteousness". As a matter of fact, it's the most natural thing in the world—because we like to be in control, including in control of our salvation (through our good moral behavior). Then we can take credit for it. Then we don't owe God anything (including worship and trusting in his grace and love).

Paul writes to the early church (and for us today) to help us remember that our Christian life isn't about our performance—it's about God's gift of eternal life in Christ that we receive by faith. Paul also reminds us that we couldn't live the Christian life if we wanted to—we are selfish sinners saved by grace!

So two themes run through Galatians that can set us free today: first, that we live "in Christ", and second, that we walk "in the Spirit". There is no other way to be "set free" and experience the life God has for us today!

I invite you to join me as we look at Galatians over the next 5-6 weeks, in a message series entitled "Free At Last!" I believe you will discover a new freedom "in Christ" that will break you out of old habits, hurtful thought patterns, and time wasting worry, and start you down a path of fruitfulness and rich living!

#### 2019 Love Offering

Each year, churches in the UMC Minnesota Conference take a Love Offering for missions. The offering is brought to the Annual Conference session by our pastor in June. ## OFFERING FINANCIAL GIFTS



#### Lao Samphan Methodist Church

The United Methodist Church's presence in Laos is growing through the Lao Samphan Methodist Church ("Samphan" means "united"). Rev. Daniel Yang, a Minnesota elder now serving as a United Methodist missionary in Laos, oversees new church development, training and equipping leaders, and pastoral support. Yang and other leaders are working to establish a Methodist presence in 17 provinces in Laos, develop committed church members and leaders, build relationships with national and local government, and build a resource training center and dormitory. They're also creating programs to support the socio-economic development of both church members and communities in Laos, one of the poorest countries in the world. Love Offering funds will be used to further these efforts.



#### Volunteer Lawyers Network

Established in 1966, Volunteer Lawyers Network helps thousands of people each year by providing civil legal services to people living in poverty. It connects immigrants, single



parents, the working poor, prior offenders, the LGBTQ community, and others with top lawyers in the state, who donate their time to support equal access to justice. All services are provided at no cost to clients, 7,300 of whom were served in fiscal year 2018. Love Offering funds will go toward the Immigrant Legal Services program, through which volunteer lawyers and staff partner with community organizations—including Northfield UMC—to provide culturally competent services to immigrant and refugee neighbors.

### Volunteers in Mission Scholarships



Mission trips change the lives of participants by giving them an opportunity to grow in faith and gain a new perspective of

the world. Through the United Methodist Church's Volunteers in Mission program, teams spend up to two weeks working on mission projects domestically or abroad. Most teams from Minnesota are engaged in hands-on projects that build infrastructure to ensure that nutritional, medical, and educational programs in developing countries become sustainable and locally run. Team members pay their own way, and the Love Offering helps to offset the cost for first-time participants.

## **CONFERENCE CONNECTIONS**

All United Methodist churches are connected through shared mission and ministry and united in their efforts to grow in love of God and neighbor, reach new people, and heal a broken world. Check out these news tidbits from the Minnesota Annual Conference, which serves all 350 United Methodist churches in the state.

- Bishop Ough: Living and dreaming together: Bishop Bruce R. Ough recently said his heart is broken to see The United Methodist Church so divided and shared his dream: "I dream of a church that is colorful, diverse, and full of love. I dream of a church that is passionately evangelical and transformative in its mission. I dream of a church that is deeply Wesleyan and wonderfully welcoming. I dream of a church that freely and boldly provides space for all who are gifted and called by God." He acknowledged the cries of lament, anxiety, and anger following General Conference 2019 and pledged to lead the conference to remain focused on making disciples. He advised Minnesota United Methodists: "Do not lose sight of or heart for our first love—the mission of Jesus. In the midst of upheaval, Jesus' mission remains the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow."
- 2019 Annual Conference—Dare to Reach: Love Boldly!: June 18-20, 2019, St. Cloud. Join us as a voting member or a visitor! Drawing on John 4:1-26, we will look at how Jesus calls us to step out of our comfort zone and reach new people for Christ. We will tell our collective story of how God's love quenches our thirst, and explore ways to invite everyone to drink from the well so that their thirst is quenched. #### BRIGHT SPOTS IN OUR MIDST

- Minnesota lay speaker delivers 500th sermon: Back in 2004, Jack Rogers' pastor told him he was going to start preaching at a senior living complex. "There's got to be someone more qualified than me," he recalls telling Rev. Rachel McIver Morey, who now serves Northfield UMC. But she insisted that he was up for the task. So after Rogers accompanied her a few times and watched her preach, he reluctantly delivered a sermon himself and eventually went through lay speaker training. Now, 15 years later, Rogers recently completed his 500th lay sermon. "The more success I have, the better the example Christ is making me for other people," he said. "I'm not educated, I'm not good-looking, I'm not athletic, I'm not well-spoken, I'm not well-dressed. I'm as plain and ordinary as you can get...If I can do it, anyone can do it."
- Lydia Project exceeds pledge goal: For the past year, nearly 200 churches across the Dakotas-Minnesota Area have been creating beautiful, hand-made purple scarves for General Conference 2020 participants as a gesture of welcome. This initiative, called the Lydia Project (after Lydia in Acts 16), aims to provide warm hospitality to all who join in the work of legislation, fellowship, and worship when our global connection meets in Minneapolis in May 2020. The number of scarves pledged recently exceeded the ambitious 10,000 goal! Thanks be to God!
