Connecting the Dots

Sometimes life is about strange juxtapositions... and what a strange word: juxtapositions! But I digress...

Things that seem disconnected—those strange juxta... well, you know disconnected events, thoughts, experiences—if you think about them for awhile, they may give meaning to one another. As you let them all dance around in your brain, you start to find connections, context, clarity.



There have been some notable deaths recently: big stars, folks like Doris Day and

Tim Conway. Their deaths remind some of us that a generation is passing away, and with them, a world that many of us used to occupy. A world that won't come by again.

Graduations are now in season! High school, college, even preschool and elementary school celebrations of moving on to a new season in life. Life is ever moving; we can't make it stand still. We have no choice but to wake up in a new day tomorrow; it won't be today again.

The next season is summer—if we can somehow wish it to arrive, beating back the rains and chilly weather that makes us doubt that it's really been "spring"! But June is right around the corner and the next few months mark a different pace for many folks: time away from school; time for vacations; time for activities that we haven't enjoyed since the last warm day before the long hibernation began; time as a gift given by longer days—time, period.

So as I think about these things, trying to make the connections—the passing of the famous, the transition of graduations, and the change of pace brought on by summer—I ask myself a question.

Am I living well (are we all)? What am I doing with the gift of time (days, months, years)? And if time <u>is</u> a gift, how do I say "thank you" for it? Who do I thank ('whom' do I thank)? What is expected of me—of my stewardship of this gift of time?

As a Christian, one of my responses is to thank God, acknowledging that he is the source of this gift of time—of *life*. But having read the Bible for many years, I also know God gives an invitation—no, it's more than an invitation—it's actually a *command*—concerning time. God invites us (yes, *commands us*) into Sabbath rest—a different "use" of time. Abraham Herschel, the Jewish author of *The Sabbath*, describes it this way:

"How should we weigh the difference between the Sabbath and the other days of the week? When a day like Wednesday arrives, the hours are blank, and unless we lend significance to them, they remain without character. The hours of the seventh day (Sabbath) are significant in themselves; their significance and beauty do not depend on any work, profit or progress we may achieve. They have the beauty of grandeur."

Can we ever really be good stewards of normal time (*Wednesdays, etc.*) if we cannot enter into Sabbath time; time that does not grasp, does not consume, does not stress, does not seek gain? Are we thankful to God for the gift of time if we cannot gift some of it back to him for the sake of our souls, for the sake of balance in our lives? Can we ever "Sabbath"?

Just the juxtaposition of some random thoughts...see you Sunday?

Friendly Fellowship




Friendly Fellowship will not meet in June, but please stay tuned for our July outing! When the date is known, we will share it in our weekly announcements.


Mark these dates on your calendar: June 9th-13th. The fun starts at 6:00 PM and goes until 8:30 PM each night.

All United Methodist churches are connected through shared mission and ministry and united in their efforts to grow in love of God and neighbor, reach new people, and heal a broken world. Check out these news tidbits from the Minnesota Annual Conference, which serves all 350 United Methodist churches in the state. ministry in a different way. Whereas regular ELI interns spend two months taking a deep dive within a single host congregation, ELI 2.0 interns will mentor the new interns, attend worship at different churches each week, participate in a social justice or community engagement project of their choosing, and learn from two mentors. One former ELI intern is now pastoring a Minnesota church, and several others are pursuing candidacy in the conference. Thanks be to God for these young leaders!

- Live stream Annual Conference: Even if you're not planning to attend Annual Conference (June 18-20 in St. Cloud), you can still tune in to all plenary sessions via live streaming—including two teaching sessions by Rev.
